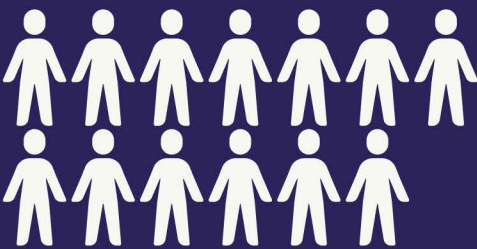


LAS Libraries MP1 Statistics

We've had an amazing first Marking Period in the LAS Libraries and are on track to have our best ever borrowing year, thanks to all of you amazing readers! Keep up the great work!

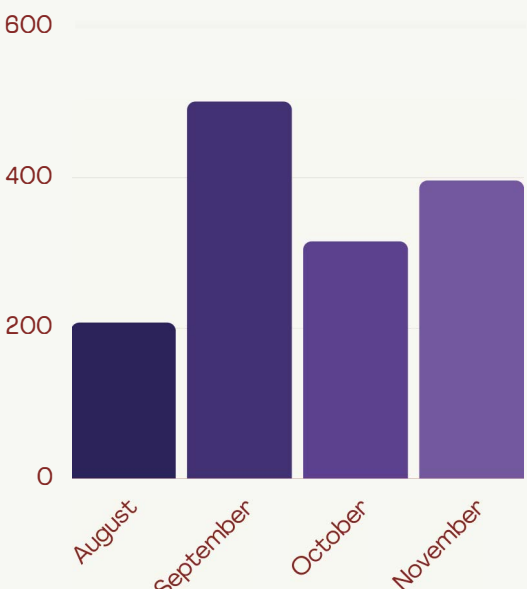
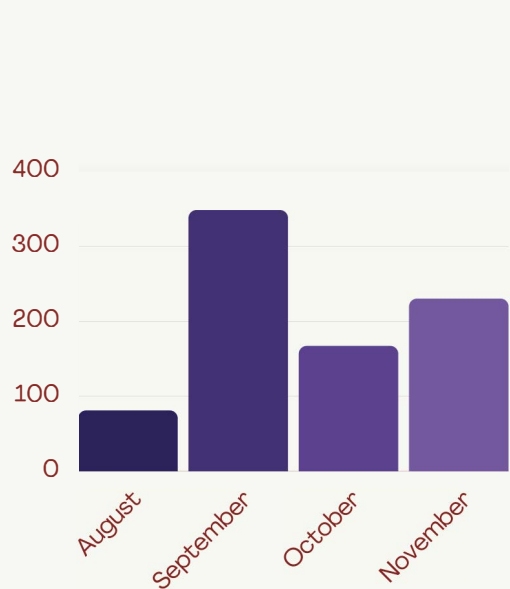
BORROWING

- 13 items checked out per student



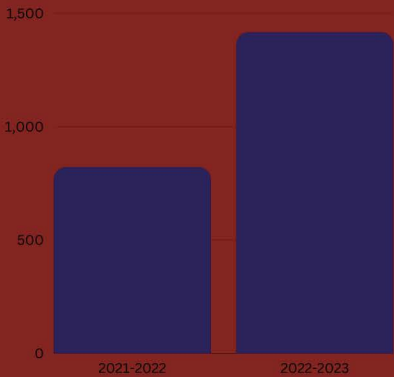
AUG-NOV 2021 VS AUG-NOV 2022

Our print borrowing has improved significantly compared to the same period last year.



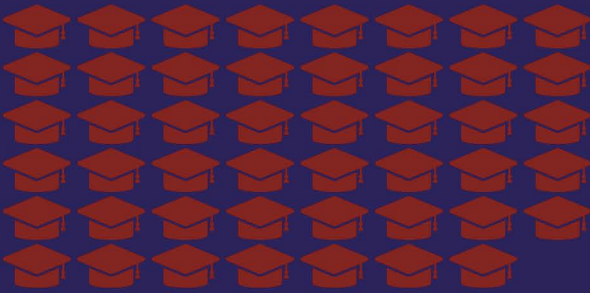
BORROWING INCREASE

SO WHAT? WHY DOES IT MATTER?

This is some information that explains why books, reading and library time are so important.

Regular reading for pleasure enhances student performance in literacy (Merga)



Reading regularly supports academic performance in other subject areas (Sullivan and Brown)



Regular readers are aware of more vocabulary items than non-readers (Cunningham and Stanovich)



Reading fiction improves social skills such as empathy (Stansfield and Bunce)



Reading can also promote wellbeing by providing an escape and helping students regulate their emotions (Merga)



Research has linked access to well-staffed libraries to student literacy performance (Lance and Kachel)



Audiobooks improve reading accuracy, comprehension, speed, motivation, and teach pronunciation (Wendt)
