**Facilities Reservations:** All requests for facility use within the White Bear Lake Area School District #624 should be made on either the Facility Scheduling Voicemail Line, 651-407-7503, or email your request to: facilities@isd624.org.

Refunds & Prorating: Notify Community Services & Recreation immediately if you need to withdraw from a class. Full refunds or credits are given if a class is canceled. Refunds are not issued after a class has begun. There are no prorated fees. To receive a refund, minus a processing fee, you must withdraw from an activity at least 3 business days prior to the first day of the activity.

Processing fees for classes:

- Under \$50 have a \$5 fee
- \$50-\$149 have a \$10 fee
- \$150-\$399 have a \$20 fee
- \$400+ have a \$30 fee

**UCare Discount:** UCare members may be eligible for a \$15 discount on most classes. If a class is less than \$15, the class will be free of charge. Members must have UCare at the time of registration and during the class(es). Members need to include their UCare ID number when registering. This discount cannot be used for the following classes: Private lessons, alcohol-related activities, high-risk activities (skydiving, rock climbing, etc.), and gambling trips. To have your discount applied, you must call 651-407-7501 to register.

Your Privacy is Important to Us: Your registration information is considered private data under state and federal law. Information is used for the purposes of administering the activity, contacting you about upcoming activities, events or activity changes. If you choose to withhold this information, this could limit the distribution of information to the participant or instructor.





Conversations and Support

With our first snowfall in the books and winter quickly approaching, I want to take a moment to say thank you for helping us successfully kick off the 2022-23 school year. This fall has felt more back to the norm than it has in recent years, with memorable athletic contests and events taking place, connections made during community meetings, and meaningful volunteer programs launching once again.

Much of the conversation in the district this fall has been related to the Capital Projects Levy Renewal that was on the Nov. 8 election ballot and passed with 59.5% approval. The levy renewal will fund safety and security measures and equipment throughout the district, classroom technology and equipment, curriculum and instruments, and buses and vans for student transportation. The ballot question was a renewal of an expiring levy at the same tax rate. It is projected to generate \$2,590,309 beginning in 2024 and will continue for an additional 10 years. We appreciate that our community members took time to learn about the levy renewal and ultimately approved continuation of this essential funding for our district. We are incredibly grateful for this renewed vote of confidence and support in our schools, our staff and our students.

Support has also been shown by community members who have given their time to participate in formal conversations about the district's future through Strategic Plan Action Teams that met throughout the fall.

# Minnesota Comprehensive Assessments (MCA)

Student proficiency is measured by the Minnesota Comprehensive Assessment (MCA) tests, Minnesota's state requirement for testing under the Federal Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA).

Due to ongoing challenges with the COVID-19 pandemic, the participation rate for the MCA in spring 2022 was lower than in previous years, although we saw a recovery from the low in spring 2021. White Bear Lake Area Schools typically has seen more than a 95% participation rate for both assessments. Math had a 91.5% participation rate and Reading had a 94.4% participation rate. The state-level participation rate was similar.

### **Early Childhood**

All of the District's preschools have a Parent Aware rating of four stars, the highest possible rating. Teachers assess the growth of children and take appropriate measures to ensure they are kindergarten-ready.

### **Elementary**

Students in our elementary programs are assessed by teachers using a range of grade-appropriate assessments in reading, math and science to measure progress toward local and state standards. Student proficiency is measured using MCA assessments. Instructional support is personalized so students who test below grade level receive extra intervention and support, and students who already exceed standards are challenged through our comprehensive Gifted and Talented program.

### Middle School


Our middle school students take the Minnesota Comprehensive Assessment (MCA). Teachers and counselors use these assessments along with other data to help students select courses. Intervention support is provided for students who test below grade level. Accelerated class options ensure each student is challenged.

### **High School**

High school teachers assess students through common assessments in each subject. Nationally-normed assessments include the PreACT offered to ninth and tenth graders in the fall and the PSAT and ACT offered to eleventh graders. Counselors and teachers use these data, along with an understanding of student motivation and goals, to help students select from more than 250 course offerings, including 55 college-level courses and seven career pathways areas.

# In addition to MCA data,

White Bear Lake Area Schools has utilized local academic measures that include data such as academic and socialemotional screeners, PreACT and ACT, academic grades and credits.



### Responding to student needs

Learning recovery and targeted support for each of our students was a focus throughout the 2021-22 school year as building and district teams worked to adjust instruction and intervention to meet the needs of all learners. The district also coordinated and implemented a robust set of summer programming for a wide variety of students in grades K-12.

The 4-year graduation rate for the White Bear Lake Area High School - South Campus Class of 2021 was 97.0%, 13.7 percentage points above the state average. *Graduation rate calculations follow one year behind the current graduating year.* 

WBLAS continues to be a recognized leader for developing Career Pathways aligned to workforce needs.





The White Bear Lake Area Schools Capital Projects Levy Renewal request on the November 8, 2022 ballot passed with 59.5% yes votes.

"We are incredibly grateful for this renewed vote of confidence and support in our schools, our staff and our students," said Dr. Wayne Kazmierczak, superintendent. "We appreciate that our community members took time to learn about the levy renewal and ultimately approved this essential funding for our district."

The Capital Projects Levy Renewal will be used to fund safety and security measures and equipment throughout the district, classroom technology and equipment, curriculum and instruments, and buses and vans for student transportation. The question on the ballot was a renewal of an expiring levy at the same tax rate, as a straight renewal of an existing levy.

"We are proud that our district's fiscal credibility is high," said Tim Wald, assistant superintendent for finance and operations. "When we surveyed our community, we learned that 89% of respondents believe the community receives a good value from its investment and 80% believe we have spent past referendum revenue responsibly. We do not take the community's trust for granted, and we will continue to be good stewards of the community's support."

Renewal of the levy is projected to generate \$2,590,309 beginning in 2024 and will continue for an additional 10 years.

### **Building Construction Updates**

Since 2019, when the community supported a bond referendum, the list of completed facilities projects has grown to include quite a few locations. As we work toward completing the district-wide projects, which are scheduled to be completed through the 2024-25 academic year, the changes to the district's landscape are hard to miss.

The list of completed facilities projects has grown to include the Transportation Facility, Area Learning Center (ALC), and elementary additions at Birch Lake, Lakeaires, Lincoln, Matoska, Otter Lake, Vadnais Heights and Willow Lane. Gymnasium, classroom and office spaces were added at WBLAHS - South Campus as part of the plan to transition the building into a middle school when North Campus becomes the site of the unified high school in the fall of 2024. In Hugo, the new North Star Elementary opened for students this fall.

Other projects still in process include Oneka Elementary, which began last month, and Central Middle School, which is in the design phase. The future conversion of Sunrise Park Middle School to become a multi-use facility that houses District Offices, Early Childhood, Transition Education Center (TEC) and the Senior Program is also on the horizon.

The unified high school project is moving right along as well, with the building's current ninth and tenth grade students moving into the new 3-story classroom addition at the semester break so that renovation work can take place in the existing building.

Before the extensive work in the original portion of the building begins, we will host a community-wide event on Tuesday, January 18 to allow students, families, grads and community members the opportunity to "walk the circles" of North Campus one last time. Watch for additional information to be shared about this fun Circle Back event!
