East Hartford, CT

Located in Hartford County on the east bank of the Connecticut River, East Hartford houses a diverse community of 51,000 residents (2020 census). The town covers about18.7 square miles, including neighborhoods of Burnside Hockanum and Mayberry Village. It is home to aerospace manufacturer, Pratt & Whitney and Rentschler Field, a stadium used by the University of Connecticut and others for football and soccer games with a capacity of 40,000.
