Family Activity

Let's play SKUNK

Families can engage in a fun and competitive game of SKUNK.

Watch this short video from Maths4Kids * on how to play!

- Each player begins by dividing a paper into 5 columns with the letters SKUNK written at the top of each column.
- 2. Player 1 rolls 2 dice. The sum (or product for older students) is written under the S.
- Player 1 decides to end their turn or roll again. If at any point they roll a 1, they lose all points for this turn and their turn is over!
- Player 2 goes next by recording sums/products under the S on their scorecard.
- Play goes back and forth until all players have filled in all 5 columns.
- Note that if at any point a player rolls two 1's ("snake eyes"), they lose all points up until that point in the game!

Rock Climbing

Program Highlights

Rock climbing was conducted in Westway Sports and Fitness Center. Children learnt the basics of rock climbing on a state-of-the-art indoor climbing wall with trained instructors. They gained skills in the basics including, belay techniques and climbing etiquette. Gain strength, balance and flexibility.

Violin Starters

Our violinists were off to a great start, learning all the essentials: from violin and bow hold to playing a range of songs on open strings. We also found some magic notes (harmonics). And although our musical mascot is a Donkey, we didn't sound a bit like him (phew!). By the 8th session children were producing a beautiful sound on their instruments, knew how to tune them and managed to play along to Jingle Bells!

Creative Ceramics

Our ceramics students learned the basic techniques of crafting with clay. The students were given a theme before each project and used their creativity and imagination to create their own pieces. Some of the pieces this season followed the theme of halloween. The students painted and glazed their projects before they were fired and taken home.

During the fall sessions, ASP Spanish covered the following themes; Self-introduction, colors and numbers, sickness and body parts vocabulary, and expressing pain in Spanish. The students also worked on 'I need and I have', common tropical fruits while reading aloud "el pregón de frutas" along with the preposition of place in Spanish building an "altar". The students enjoyed projects on the topic of Dia de Muertos, a cultural activity celebrating dia de Los Muertos on November 2nd.
