



- Goal: In the FALL 2021, 51% of third grade students met fall literacy benchmarks as measured by FastBridge aReading assessments. In SPRING 2022, we will increase the percent of students meeting third grade benchmark assessments by 6.8 percentage points to 57.8%.
- Actual: In the FALL 2021, 51% of third grade students met fall benchmarks as measured by FastBridge aReading assessments. In SPRING 2022, we had 62.1% meeting third grade benchmarks. 11.1 percent increase.



# All Students Graduate from High School



The percent of all students graduating from **Winona Senior High School** will increase 4.4% in 2020-21.The expected 2021 graduation rate will be 90.6% **Results: 87.4% (increase of 1.2% - missed target by 3.2%)** 

The percent of students graduating from **Winona Area Learning Center** will increase 5.1% in 2020-21. The expected 2021 graduation rate will be 22.3% **Results: 34.4% (increase of 16.5% - exceeded target by 12.1%)** 

The percent of students graduating from **WAPS District Wide** will increase 3.3 % in 2020-21. The expected 2021 graduation rate will be 81.8% **Results: 79.7% (increase of 1.2% - missed target by 2.1%)**
