Tip of the Week: ACT Science Tips and Techniques 6-10

- 1. Don't Re-read: If you find yourself very confused or re-reading the question more than twice, pick a choice and move on.
- 2. For the scientist's views: Read if and only when you need to. Read the question first, just like the ACT reading part, and then find the answer in the passage.
- 3. Extra practice: In addition to the book drills, google random graphs and tables and see if you can spot trends, information, etc. to improve your graphing skills.
- 4. Review terms covered earlier in this session: To remind yourself about IV, DV, etc. .
- 5. Speed: Work quickly but accurately

Tim Gloriod '16

University of Missouri - Columbia | Bachelors of Arts in Sociology



Tim Gloriod is a 2016 graduate of St. Dominic High School who was a four year member of the Crusaders' football team. Tim remembers back to his time at St. Dominic as one that created an environment of selflessness, and ultimately led him to want to pursue a career that made a difference in people's lives. Tim would go on to the University of Missou-

ri-Columbia (Mizzou) where he also played on the Rugby team while earning his degree in Sociology with a minor in Criminal Justice.
