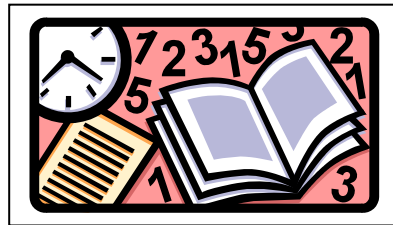
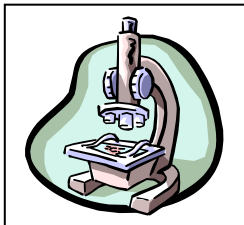
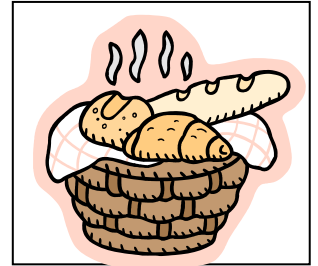

The Learning Fair is a celebration to show that learning is fun for everyone!

It is not limited to science. You may complete a project and a display on any topic you choose. You may choose music, cooking, computers, icebergs, sewing, dolphins, bikes, a famous person, or anything YOU are interesting in learning more about.



In the weeks to come you will be receiving more information about planning your project, completing it, and then displaying it. Think about what you'd like to learn about as you're relaxing over Christmas vacation. You could even begin the project if you have time!

Check with your teacher about the requirements in your classroom for the Learning Fair. In some classes it is extra credit and in others it may take the place of another assignment. The main idea of the Learning Fair is that YOU have fun learning something new!

## GETTING STARTED

If you decide to do a project for the Learning Fair, your next step is to choose a topic.

**Here are some things to consider as you prepare.**

1. **What are you interested in learning more about?** Is it science, social studies, building, cooking, the Bible? Pick something you know just a little about. Choose something you are interested in learning more about.
2. **Will you need adult help?** There are some projects that will require you to have a bit of adult help along the way. You may need assistance in gathering the materials or you might need someone to help you use the internet for research.
3. **How much time do you have?** If you start now you will have about six weeks to complete the project. If you begin in January, you'll have four weeks.
4. **What do you want your project to involve?** – Will it include experimenting, researching, experiencing, creating or recreating?

**Experimenting** will probably involve a science type project. Be sure to state the problem or what you are trying to discover. Record what you are doing and what is occurring throughout the process. Take pictures or draw what is happening.

**Researching** will involve stating what you are looking for in your research. Your research might take you to the library, the post office, or some other place of business. *Remember to have someone take your picture to show places you visited for your research.*

**Experiencing** might be finding out what your parents really do at work or what another job requires. Keep a record of your experiences either by making a journal or taking pictures or both.

**Whatever you decide to do, the point is to LEARN and to have fun learning!**
