

What is a FID Day at Upper Perk?



A Flexible Instructional Day (FID) counts as an actual day of school because students are working on grade level content and skills. The difference with a FID day is that students are NOT in the buildings.

A FID day will be called by our Superintendent in cases when circumstances prevent the delivery of instruction in its customary manner or location. For example, this could include an epidemic, hazardous weather condition, law enforcement emergency, inoperability of school buses or other equipment necessary to the public school entity's operation, damage to a school building(s), or another temporary circumstance rendering any portion of a school building(s) unfit or unsafe for use. What should we expect?

- Lesson plans/student work/activities for students will be posted by teachers by Secondary teachers (grades 6-12) by 9 AM, and by 10 AM by Elementary teachers (grades K-5).
- **Kindergarten - 5th Grade Students** - K-5 will have assignments from English Language Arts and Math, as well as the "special" they would have had that day (Art, Music, PE, Library, FLITE or K Discovery). Students should look on Google Classroom, or See Saw (whatever their teacher has communicated) to find the plans for the day. If assistance is needed, students should email the teacher or attend the live Zoom support session.
- **6th - 12th Grade Students** - 6-12 students will have assignments from ALL classes that would meet on the FID day. Students should look on Schoology or Google Classroom (whatever their teacher has communicated) to find the plans for the day. If assistance is needed, students should email the teacher. The day of the cycle will be clearly communicated on Schoology/Google Classroom so students know what special(s) to attend.
- **Students will access materials as they normally would on Schoology, Google Classroom, or See Saw**, but we will also post the Lesson Plans/Student work/Activities on our website. Look for a section entitled, "FID DAY LESSON PLANS" on the landing page of our website to click and find your child's teacher and assignments.
- **All assigned work should be submitted by 4pm on the given FID day**, as directed by their teacher(s). If students struggle or are confused, please contact the teacher via email for assistance, and have the student submit their best effort. Teachers will be available for at least 1.5 hours via Zoom to assist students needing help. The times will be communicated by teachers.
