WHY BOARD ACTION IS NECESSARY The Highline School District's Board of Directors is required to adopt a resolution accepting the Building Commissioning Report for the Highline High School Replacement Project in accordance with WAC 392-344-165 and the Office of Superintendent of Public Instruction (OSPI) Form D-11, Application to Release Retainage.
III. BACKGROUND INFORMATION Sazan Environmental Services was selected to provide commissioning services for the Highline High School Replacement Project. The final commissioning report was completed on October 24, 2022. The final report verifies that the building systems have been installed as specified in the construction documents and are performing as designed.
The Highline High School Replacement Project was partially funded through OSPI. OSPI's Form D-11, Application to Release Retainage, is required to be submitted to OSPI at the completion of the project. Form D-11, per WAC 392-344-165, requires a resolution by the board of directors accepting the building commissioning report. The Building Commissioning Report Executive Summary is attached.

Executive Summary

Säzän Environmental Services (SES) was hired under contract by Highline School District to provide third-party Commissioning Authority (CxA) services for the Highline High School Replacement Project. The SES Commissioning Authority team was led by Kevin David, CCP. Joel Davis served as the Managing Principal and Shane Doig as the Commissioning Operations Manager.

The Highline High School Replacement Project included a new building, HVAC systems with associated controls, lighting and day lighting systems, switched receptacles, and domestic hot water systems. The commissioning scope of this project included new mechanical, electrical, and plumbing systems. Commissioning services were executed per the criteria of the AABC Commissioning Group (ACG), Building Commissioning Association (BCA), LEED 2009 WSSP E4.0 and E4.1. All fundamental and enhanced commissioning, and Washington Sustainable Schools Protocols meet the requirements of the 2015 Washington State Energy Code (WSEC)

A Commissioning Plan was developed and executed by the CxA, and project team as detailed in the attached Executed Commissioning Plan. The Executed Commissioning Plan contains an overview of the process utilized on this project and the results of each step in the process. The specific work products of the commissioning effort are located in the appendices as referenced in the executed commissioning plan.

The commissioning process for the Highline High School Replacement Project was successful in meeting the targeted energy codes and requirements. Installation of equipment was observed to be per construction documents, and system functional testing was completed successfully with all documented issues resolved by the project team. The final TAB report was recently approved by the engineering team.
