GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

23 credits in grades 9-12, including requirements in the following:

English	4 credits (one each year; at least one year beyond ESL coursework)
Mathematics	4 credits (through Algebra 2; one course each year)
History	3 credits (including U.S. History)
Laboratory Science	3 credits (Biology and Chemistry required)
World Language	2 credits (two high school years; at least through level 3)
Fine Arts	2 credits
Physical Education	2 credits (either one sport or After School PE each year)

Additional graduation requirements include annual summer reading, community service, and the completion of a senior speech. English language learners are directed to take a world language if they are able to fulfill two years of study in that language.

ENGLISH AS A SECOND LANGUAGE

ESL Course Offerings: ESL English 1, ESL English 2, ESL Literature 1, ESL Literature 2, ESL History, ESL Support

As of the 2021-2022 school year, ESL courses are no longer offered based on grouped levels

Students are tested upon arrival and in each subsequent semester for placement in the ESL program. Students exiting the ESL program often take Writing Seminar in addition to their college preparatory English class. Students may repeat ESL classes for credit.
