Reviewed Project Ideas:

- Discussion around student/teacher relationship building

 of the Student Senate
- Connection to teachers is a necessary part of students wanting to be here
- Student desire to appease staff members as well, want staff to understand them
- Taking a day to learn about your teacher-
- Get to know you and what is going on in your day
- Information on the website about each teacher

Advisory and SEL:

- Strategy of using points to participate pushes students away from wanting to connect
- Mix up student/staff and have conversations during advisory time
- Removing punishment of not participating/no points
- Once a month/every other week to building a connection

General Discussion:

- Concerns about students actually participating, students actually wanting to be involved and actually staying on campus.
- "Teachers struggle to learn about students in this school" lacking connection at this school
- No one wants to be in class with people who act like they are only the authority figure
- Want a friend/mentor relationship, not just a mentor/authority figure
- Favoritism and how does it work with students, how do you feel about attention, having similar interests— Staff/teacher should work to bridge gap despite favoritism or similar interests
- Having office hours/other options for students to communicate that they need help/attention
- Having boundaries with staff/student relationships- creating a way to communicate that
 there are times/days or other reasons that students may not want to be called on (ex. I
 don't want to read out loud-students survey given and kept by teacher)
