



Legislative Update

The Legal Department at Charter School Specialists continues to monitor legislative updates and changes or updates to the Ohio Administrative Code. The Legal Policy Presentation training video will be released later this month and that training video will provide a more in depth look at all of the recent legislation since the 2021 Legal Policy Presentation. The changes listed below are a snapshot of the most recent updates since August 1, 2022. For more information on any of these topics, please contact the Charter School Specialists Legal Department at jkee@charterschoolspec.com.

Ohio Revised Code New Legislation since May 1, 2022

ORC 3313.5317 (from SB 181 effective 5/30/2022) – a school may not prohibit the wearing of religious apparel while competing or participating in interscholastic athletics or extracurricular activities. This code also prohibits a school from requiring a waiver to wear religious apparel in athletics or extracurricular activities. There is an exception to the rule, if the school, athletic organization, or official of the event or activity identifies a legitimate danger to participants. If a legitimate danger is identified, the administrator or event official must offer all reasonable accommodations.

HB 583 (effective 09/23/2022) — is a hodgepodge of rule changes including the establishment of a tutor program; elimination of certain reporting in EMIS; expansion of qualifications for Ed Choice scholarships; changes to funding formulas for English learners, funding bases, catastrophic costs and internet or computer based schools; a delay of the implementation of the dyslexia screening requirements; extends for 2 years the ability for Governing Authority members to hire individuals without bachelor degrees as substitute teachers; creates a Substitute Teacher Shortage Committee with a report due in December 2022; and permits community schools to enter into a contract with a new sponsor without prior approval from the Department of

 SB 361 Introduced into the Senate on 10/03/2022 The proposed bill seeks to expand the eligibility of veterans of the U.S. armed forces to become teachers by eliminating the need for a bachelor's degree provided that the veteran meets the qualifications listed. The proposed bill does not restrict the hiring of veterans to only substitute teaching positions so a veteran hired under the proposed bill could be hired as a full-time educator.

Ohio Administrative Code Rule Updates since August 1, 2022

3301-44 (effective 08/26) – establishes criteria and definitions for an adult diploma pilot program.

- 3301-35-01 (effective date 10/28) online learning and blended learning defined as more than 50% of the time over the course of a school year; competency-based learning model is defined; computer as instructor is defined 3301-35-03 (effective date 10/28) requires blended learning students have annual instructional calendar of at least
- 910 hours.
- 3301-35-16 (effective date 10/28) establishes criteria, guidelines, and requirements for online learning schools. There is also the requirement that the school track the time students participate in learning activities and it must be at least 910 hours.
- 301-51-11 (effective date 10/28) modifies the public school preschool general education class definition and gives an additional option for placement when considering the least restrictive alternative.

 3301-83-10 (effective date 10/28) permits new and re-certifying school bus drivers to do online classroom in place of in person classroom learning.

The last legal update that was provided was in the April 2022 Sponsor Connection. In that issue there were a number of bills on that list. Of that list the only bill that appears likely to be passed is HB 606. HB 606 is a bill to enact Sarah's Law for Seizure Safe Schools. The bill passed the house on May 25, 2022, and was introduced into the Senate on May 27, 2022. The Senate referred this bill to committee on May 31, 2022, and there have been no updates since then. It is currently still in committee but may be passed with some amendments.

Afterschool Childhood Enrichment Program (ACE)

The Ohio Afterschool Child Enrichment (ACE) Educational Savings Account program provides funds to lowincome families for various enrichment and educational activities. The program is offered through a contract between Merit International, Inc. and the Ohio Department of Education. ACE is available to any Ohio child ages 8 - 18 years old whose family income is at or below 300% of the Federal Poverty Level. Eligible children include those who attend an Ohio public or nonpublic school and participate in home education.

Once a family qualifies for the ACE Educational Savings account program, Merit has provided a portal called the Education Marketplace where families can use the funds to pay for educational value activities. Allowable activities under the ACE program include before- and after-school educational programs, day camps (including camps for academics, music, and arts), tuition for learning extension centers, the purchase of curriculum and material for home-school families, educational learning or study skills services, field trips to historical landmarks/museums/ science centers/ theater, language classes, musical instrument lessons, and

Free Threat Assessment Trainings for Schools

Federal Programs Reminder for November

The Ohio Department of Education, Office of Federal Programs (OFP) should be notifying schools regarding the type of audit they will be receiving for this fiscal year. There are three types of audits performed by OFP. Self-Evaluation Review, Desk Review, and on-site Reviews. The pandemic prevented OFP from conducting on-site reviews. Since the pandemic restrictions are easing, the OFP may be conducting on-site reviews this year. This means schools should prepare for audits by gathering supporting documentation for federal requirements. You can review the list of documents that may be required for an audit HERE. If you want to see the basis for determining the type of audit, please click HERE for the Risk Factors.

Most schools should have received carryover funds once their Final Expenditure Report (FER) was approved. These funds should be budgeted as soon as possible to establish the earliest possible substantially approved date. Schools should concentrate on expending their ARP ESSER III funds. Schools may also receive notice regarding the Maintenance of Effort requirement (MOE). As a reminder, schools must spend the same amount or 90% of their general fund expenditures as in the prior fiscal year to receive the school's full federal allocation. Schools failing to meet MOE may have their FY23 allocation reduced by the percentage that MOE was missed. For example, if a school misses MOE by 5%, then the school will have its federal funds reduced by 5%. Please be aware that there are two types of MOE. One for general education and one for special education. Schools must meet the exact expenditures of general funds in the previous year in special education. There are some factors that may permit a school to reduce their special education MOE. Please contact ODE Office for Exceptional Children with any question on special education MOE.



Definitions:

Overall School Rating – A combination of the school's Achievement rate, Gap Closing component, Progress component, and Graduation Rates form the school's Overall Rating.

Combined Graduation Rate – Looks at the percentage of students who are successfully completing high school with a diploma in 4,5,6,7 and 8 years.

Achievement (fixe High School Test Passage Rate) – Represents the number of students who passed all five state tests that are required for graduation.

Progress – Looks at the progress students in grades 9-12 are making in math and reading.

Gap Closing - Reflects how well subgroups of students are meeting the state's performance expectations in reading, math and graduation rates.
