These are the easiest to earn



Look on college website under "Financial Aid" or "Scholarships"

Many are automatic based on SAT/ACT and GPA



Look at requirements and set goals for standardized test scores



Fill out the <u>FAFSA</u> after October 1st senior year



Many will be offered through an internal scholarship generator



Talk to college recruiters to see what is available for you



Keep applying even while in college – still eligible!

Example of Scholarships for Family in Ministry: Baylor University

Baptist Minister's Dependent Scholarship

Baylor awards scholarships of \$5,000 per academic year to the dependents of pastors, ministers of music, ministers of education, and other full-time ministers actively serving or officially retired from serving a Baptist congregation, a state convention or agency in a ministerial role certified by a Baptist convention. Students must provide documentation of their parent's employment in a ministerial capacity by a Baptist church or other Baptist entity. This scholarship is renewable beyond the initial year provided the student continues to maintain full-time undergraduate enrollment status and a minimum 2.5 Baylor cumulative GPA.

Baptist Missionaries' Dependent Scholarship

Baylor awards scholarships of \$5,000 per academic year to the dependents of missionaries actively serving or officially retired from serving a Baptist mission agency. Students must provide documentation of their parent's employment in this capacity. Renewal of this scholarship is contingent on the student maintaining full-time undergraduate enrollment status, and a minimum 2.5 Baylor cumulative GPA.

Ministry Scholarship

Baylor, in cooperation with the Baptist General Convention of Texas, provides educational assistance to Baptist students who are preparing for careers in church-related vocational ministry. Currently, the amount of this scholarship is 20 percent of tuition for Baylor undergraduate hours. For further information, please click here.

Presidential Denominational

Baylor awards scholarships of \$1,500 per academic year to Baptist students who provide confirmation of their participation in the Challengers Program (formerly the High School Baptist Young Men Program) or the Studiact Program (formerly Acteens Program). Challengers participants must also provide proof of having received the National Leadership Award. Studiact participants must show proof of having completed all six Quest levels (formerly, Acteens had to receive the Texas Acteens Citation Award). Studiact participants who have served as Texas state or national panelists for the WMU are also eligible. This scholarship is renewable for a total of 8 undergraduate semesters, provided the student maintains full-time undergraduate enrollment status and a minimum 2.5 Baylor cumulative GPA.

Baptist Youth Speakers Scholarship

Students who provide confirmation of their participation in the Baptist Youth Speakers Tournament and who place either first, second or third at the state level competition will receive an annual scholarship for \$5,000, \$3,500, or \$2,500 respectively. Students are only eligible for one Baptist Youth Speakers Tournament scholarship regardless of the number of times they have placed in the competition. This scholarship is renewable for a total of 8 undergraduate semesters, provided the student maintains full-time undergraduate enrollment status and a minimum 2.5 Baylor cumulative GPA. Pay attention to if a scholarship is "stackable"



Earning some college scholarships may disqualify you from others



Ask college recruiter if there are additional scholarships available



Colleges combine grants and scholarships in financial aid packet which is presented in early spring senior year



Financial aid packets can be negotiated up to May 1st





The Coca-Cola Scholars Program Scholarship

The Coca-Cola Scholars Program scholarship is an achievement-based scholarship awarded to graduating high school seniors. Students are recognized for their capacity to lead and serve, as well as their commitment to making a significant impact on their schools and communities. With the 33rd class in 2021, the Foundation has provided over 6,450 Coca-Cola Scholars with more than \$75 million in educational support. 150 Coca-Cola Scholars are selected each year to receive this \$20,000 scholarship.

The Coolidge Scholarship is an annually awarded, full-ride, presidential scholarship that covers a student's tuition, room, board, and expenses for four years of undergraduate study. The Coolidge may be used by recipients at any accredited college or university in the United States. Anyone of any background, pursuing any academic discipline of study, may apply to this non-partisan, need-blind, program.

Students apply for the Coolidge Scholarship during their junior year of high school. Finalists are flown in for a finalist weekend at the Coolidge Historic Site in Plymouth Notch, Vermont where they interview with the Coolidge Scholars Finalist Jury. Recipients of the Coolidge Scholarship are notified of their award late in their junior year, before college application (note: current high school seniors are *not eligible* to apply). Finalists who are not named Coolidge Scholars are eligible to receive a smaller, one-time, college scholarship.



In Conclusion

- Make a plan and aim for merit scholarships at intended college by setting goals for ACT and GPA
- Talk with college recruiters and see what is available
- Look for local scholarship opportunities
- Look at professional societies related to your field of study
- Ask parents and employers if included in benefits
- Use online search engine or books to find even more
- Keep a <u>record</u> with deadlines and requirements

You Can Do This!



You still have to put in some serious time and effort applying for these scholarships.

Some might ask you to write essays, answer tough questions, or even interview—but some could require little to no effort.

If you treat the scholarship search process like a part-time job by spending at least an hour a day filling out applications, it *will* pay off.
