


DIGITAL SAFETY RESOURCES



- Privacy online is a myth and no site or app can guarantee it.
- When giving out personally identifiable information ask the requestor why they need, what they are going to use it for, and how they are going to protect it
- Passwords protect any personal information online.



- Scammers pretend to be gamers to gain the trust of other players in order to break into account and steal personal information.
- Never log into your game account on a website other than the actual gaming website.
- Always turn on Two-Factor Authentication and don't use the same password across all of your accounts.



- Never wire or receive money or gift cards from online dating sites.
- If you think you are being scammed, talk to someone you trust. There is help out there.
