WHAT IS BACK TO SCHOOL NIGHT?

Back-to-School Night is our "*must attend event*" of the school year. It is the one day all year long where we have the most parents gathered on the campus at any one time. We typically hold it the 2nd week of the school year, however this year due to the modular classroom delay, we are holding it on **Wednesday, September 14 starting at 5:30pm**. This is a great opportunity for all our new families to become better acquainted with our school and community.

The evening begins in the Athletic Center for a brief welcome and overview from the Administration. We will review what's new at JPII for 2022-23, let you know all the ways to get involved with our school, and give you a sneak peak of the campus expansion plans. At 6:00pm you will begin attending classes just as your child does. Teachers will provide a brief overview of the course and how you can support and assist with learning. Please bring your child's schedule with you. If you have two or more children, you will need to team up with a spouse/partner or choose where you prefer to be. Back-to-School Night is not the time to discuss your child's progress, so please be respectful of the teacher's limited time to present information.

IT'S PICTURE TIME

Student portraits, for grades 6-11, will be taken next **Thursday**, **September 15**. The required dress is Mass uniform. That makes two consecutive mass uniform days next week. Digital and physical copies of photos will be available to order from Jostens approximately two weeks after picture day. Details will be emailed to you. If you have any specific questions, please reach out to Sam.Richardson@johnpaul2school.org. We ask that all garments are freshly ironed and cleaned prior to coming to school. No outerwear (sweatshirts, hoodies, etc.) will be permitted during the photoshoot. If a student is not in proper uniform or is otherwise out of dress code (hair, nails, pants, etc.), they will not be allowed to be photographed until the make-up day in mid-October. There are 18 gentlemen who will receive notices starting today that they are in need of a haircut. Parents will receive an email as well. No haircut no picture.

REVIEW OF START AND DISMISSAL TIMES

Now that we are finally hitting the rhythm of the new school year, I would like to remind students and parents of our start and dismissal times.

School begins at 8:20 each day. Students may arrive starting at 7:45 and report to the Commons or the Athletic Center Lobby. Any student arriving after 8:25 is considered tardy.

Monday dismissal is 2:40pm for all students. Buses will leave campus at 2:50pm. Sports begin at 3:00pm.

Tuesday and Thursday dismissal is at 2:40pm.

Wednesday dismissal is at 2:45pm.

Friday dismissal is at 2:10. Because of the high volume of traffic of Fridays, we are working on a staggered dismissal schedule. This will be announced at Back-to-School Night.

DOCS and Middle School Advisory take place on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday afternoons immediately after school until 3:25pm. Buses depart at 3:35pm. (Note: Advisory is required for all middle school students. DOCS is optional for high school students but may be required by the teacher). Students who are not in Advisory or DOCS must report to the Commons.

Extracurricular clubs also meet after school on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday. Sports start at 3:30pm.

Morning drop off occurs in front of the school. When arriving try to pull as far forward (to the mailbox if possible) so that we do not start backing up on 170.
