2.a. Facility Review for Softball

The meeting was opened by Mr. Hall.

Mr. Hall was asked by the Board, as the Committee Chairperson to move junior high softball from the Greiser Road to CVMS fields. The Facility Committee checked the conditions of the field; so a decision could be made. Mr. Klink reported the committee believes the fields are in poor condition, dug outs need condemned, fields are all grown in, bases are broken, and the fields are wet most of the year. It would seem a big mountain to climb to make it a competition field. Currently the District rents the Greiser field at \$200/month from Sadsbury township. It is \$200 month of each usable month and includes junior high baseball and junior high softball for a total of \$600 for three months. That is for the complex, we also line and pay for the necessary insurance but that is already figured in and not an extra cost.

Mr. Hall reported a rough estimate to get the CVMS field to competition level we are looking at \$100,000 depending on how far we go. Mr. Kimmel added drainage is rough and just to rebuild it to match CASH we are looking at \$17,000 to \$18,000 dollars for just the infield. Equipment up there, rain covers for the field, there is a lot of work. There is no parking close, people would have to park down below and walk up past the baseball field which is in worse condition and there are no bleachers. We cannot have vehicles by the field. Even if we fix the baseball fields Mr. Kimmel feels we are legitimately looking at \$80,000 to \$100,000. Mr. McQuiston felt it is an easy decision to not spend more than the \$200/month (\$600 total) for Greiser Road.

Mr. Hall announced the Committees recommendation is to keep the fields at Greiser Road, Sadsbury Township property. He will report back to the Board and appreciates everyone looking into this. Mr. McQuiston appreciated Dr. Mayle getting the information so quickly.

2.b.a. CVMS Vape Detector Request

2.b.b. CLMS Vape Detector Request

Building Principal is requesting Halo Vape detectors to be purchased and installed in 6 public restrooms in CVMS, as per detailed in backups on Agenda Manager.

Building Principal is requesting Halo Vape detectors to be purchased and installed in 8 locations in CVMS. 6 for public restrooms and 2 for competition gym locker rooms. As per detailed backup on Agenda Manager.

Mr. Kimmel reported the next three agenda items are regarding vape detector requests, for Lake and Valley Middle schools. He received an estimate based on locations, roughly \$14,800 and \$11,100 at Lake Middle. The district just put them in at the high school. He felt the numbers should be close and offered to get actual estimates for if wish. It took about 3 months to get done at the high school and realistically we cannot do it until summer. Mr. McQuiston feels it is worth looking into for exact figure, as it is hard to decide guessing on costs. Mr. Klink admitted it is a need sadly for these middle school buildings but will prevent future problems coming into high school hopefully. There is no cost in getting estimates Mr. McQuiston added. Mrs. Klink asked if there were vape detectors in the locker rooms at CASH, yes.

2.b.c. CASH Baseball/Softball Batting Cages

CASH Baseball Coaches requesting batting cage(s) for CASH Campus to be used by Baseball and Softball to be funded with Booster Funds covering part or all of the costs, as per detailed backups on Agenda Manager.

Mr. Kimmel reported there has been some discussion on the CASH batting cages and having the booster funds help. He received some rough estimates and has it down to one. He would like to push it out for actual costs but the estimate is \$11,700 ball park. \$8,500 from the Boosters paying. He has spoken with the baseball coach and can work together on this. Mr. Hall noted the softball coach has been asking for a few years, he knows they need done the question is why not put in a 2 lane cage if funding for one cage is \$11,700 he would like to see the cost difference. Baseball wants a 70 foot cage, softball is asking for smaller. He would like to get prices and can use simultaneously per Mr. Hall.

Mr. Kimmel understood and look at that, get the cost for both sizes.

Mr. Klink asked if we have machines for both? Not a matter of buying them. The assistant baseball coach was in attendance and indicated the head coach can throw a live ball. There may be times practicing curve balls 85-95 time coached from Vice President Mr. Hall indicated looking at running power but is not real interested in one for baseball or one for softball. We need it as a dual cage to benefit both programs. He will not support one.

The assistant coach rational for recommending two cages (one for softball and one for baseball) with a drop net is participation can be put in a net to make the length for softball 35-40 feet for girls and can split and have them. They can be used simultaneously. Mr. Hall asked if they can be used at the same time for boys and girls as he won't pick a team over the other. The Coach said the benefit of two cages is obvious as they can work together to make that happen. If it mirrors what he put in Sadsbury complex, there is a 4-6 feet between cages a safety barrier so to speak. Having them side by side benefits if one coach is keeping track of two cages.

Mr. Hall reiterated his recommendation is a dual cage. M
