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## THE POLICY

The Salt Lake City School District Board of Education has proactively implemented supportive enrollment policies and practices that create a welcoming and inclusive environment for all students. A variety of enrollment options are available within the district to meet the diverse needs, interests, and learning styles of students and their families. In enrolling students in district schools, the district complies with all applicable state and federal mandates in order to ensure consistent and equitable enrollment practices amongst all district schools.

The purpose of this policy is to govern enrollment requirements for both resident and non-resident students, including transfer students, homeless and/or unaccompanied youth, children of military families, and newcomer students.

The district has set forth its specific processes for implementing this board policy through the accompanying [administrative procedures](#).

No district employee or student shall be subjected to discrimination in employment or any district program or activity on the basis of age, color, disability, gender, gender identity, genetic information, national origin, pregnancy, race, religion, sex, sexual orientation, or veteran status.
