SMART GOALS #1-5 (Specific, Measurable, Attainable, Results-Based, and Time-Bound)

We will increase the percentage of students scoring 2, 3, or 4 on the American Literature EOC from 74% in 2021 to 75% in 2022 to 77% in 2023 to 80% in 2024.

We will increase the percentage of students scoring 2, 3, or 4 on the Coordinate Algebra EOC from 55% in 2021 to 65% in 2022 to 70% in 2023 to 75% in 2024.

We will increase the percentage of students scoring 2, 3, or 4 on the Biology EOC from 56% in 2021 to 65% in 2022 to 71% in 2023 to 75% in 2024.

We will increase the percentage of students scoring 2, 3, or 4 on the U.S. History EOC from 50% in 2021 to 55% in 2022 to 60% in 2023 to 65% in 2024.

We will increase the percentage of students in American Literature demonstrating reading comprehension at or above the midpoint (1285) of the College & Career Ready "Stretch" Lexile Band from 44.6% in 2021 to 47% in 2022 to 50% in 2023 to 54% in 2024.

The state provides disaggregated data for EOC. PHS teachers and administrators further analyze and disaggregate the results in order to provide necessary safety nets and interventions for students. The PHS teachers, administration, and leadership team share the responsibility of disaggregating and analyzing results in order to make necessary instructional adjustments and plan interventions. Data team checks to ensure validity and reliability of assessment results for each category before the state disaggregates the assessment results. EOC data is valid and reliable according to state testing criteria. Disaggregated data is reported to the faculty and staff, Student Council, Leadership Team, local school board, newspaper, and is also reported by the State of Georgia.
