- 4 Credits of English
- 4 Credits of Math (Including Algebra I & Geometry)
- 4 Credits of Science (Including Biology)
- 3 Credits of Social Studies (Including World History, U.S. History & Government/Economics)
- 2 Credits of the same foreign language
- 1 Credit Fine/Performing/Practical Arts or Speech/Debate
- 1 Credit Physical Education (Including 0.5 credit in Health & 0.5 credit in Personal Fitness)
- 26 Total Credits

These courses can be taken at FCS through the regular course offerings or through an accredited provider (i.e. Dual Enrollment, FLVS, etc.) with administrative approval.
