Welcome to the new 2022/2023 school year. The following Health Forms will be **required** upon entering school in September.

[Student Health Inventory Form](#) - Completed by a parent/guardian for all students in all grades. This will give the nurse the most up to date health information for each student.

[NYS School Health Examination Form](#) - Required for Grades K,1, 3, 5, 7, 9, 11 and New Entrants.

- *A physical must be updated within the year of school/sports starting in order to be eligible to participate in JV/Varsity and Modified sports.*

**Dental Certificate** - Requested for Grades K, 1, 3, 5, 7, 9, 11 and New Entrants.

[Medication Authorization Form](#) **and** [Independent Medication Carry and Use Form](#)

- Must be completed by parent/guardian **AND** physician if your child requires medication in school (daily or on as needed basis). This includes over-the-counter medications. Specific self-carry form needed for inhalers, epipens, diabetes management. *NEW MEDICATION FORMS NEEDED EACH NEW SCHOOL YEAR.*

Dear Parents/Guardians of Students in Grades K, 1, 3, 5, 7, 9, and 11 :

**NYS law** requires that students who will be in grades K, 1, 3, 5, 7, 9, and 11 for the 2022/2023 School Year have a Health Exam on file from a Health Care Provider in the School Health Office ***dated no earlier than September 1, 2021.***

- This health exam will only be accepted if it was done within the 12-month period prior to the beginning of this new school year through the present.
- Per law, the health exam should be submitted ***within thirty days*** after school opens. In keeping with this law, please be sure to **submit your child's health exam form.**

You can find a "[NYS School Health Examination](#)" form on the Nurse's Website on your child's school's home page under Quick Links. Your child's physician may substitute his/her own NYS approved form.

Please either fax, email or send a copy of the health form to school with your child. Please disregard this request if you have already submitted your child's Health Exam form.

**RE: Important Information Regarding Medication for 2022-2023 School Year**

Dear Parent/Guardian:

- New medication forms ([Medical Authorization Form](#)) for both prescription and over-the-counter (OTC) medications must be signed every new school year by a health care provider and parent/guardian in order for the school nurse to administer medication to your child.
- Medication must remain in the properly labeled pharmacy or original OTC container
- The parent/guardian is responsible to have medication delivered directly to the School Health Office in a properly labeled original container by an adult
- If your child will be self carrying and independently administering their rescue medications for respiratory conditions, epinephrine auto-injector, or insulin, glucagon, and related diabetes supplies, there must be a provider written permission form completed which includes an attestation that the student has demonstrated the ability to self-administer along with written parent/guardian consent. - For conditions not listed above, your child may be able to self-carry and self-administer, but the Health Office will need written permission from both you and your provider. Click on the link to access this form [Medical Authorization Form](#)

**Information for Parents/Guardians on Alcohol-Based Hand Sanitizers**

Dear Parent/Guardian

Hand washing for 30 seconds with warm soapy water is the best way to clean hands and reduce illness. If this is not available, alcohol-based hand sanitizers (ABHS) can be used.

The use of sanitizer will be done under adult supervision. Staff will be trained when to report concerns to the school nurse.

**Please share this information with your child:**

- A dime-size amount of hand sanitizer is all that is needed
- Rub over the hands until the gel is dry
- Keep their hands off their face, eyes, nose, and mouth while hands are wet
- If they have cuts on their hands or feel stinging, they should not use the sanitizer and tell their teacher

If you do not want your child to use hand sanitizer in school, or if you have any other related questions, please contact their school nurse.
