When: Tuesday, March 28, 2023

What is the Fee for taking the ACT?

ACT Fee will be \$50. You **will not** register for this test through ACT.

When is the payment due?

Payment MUST be received by January 18, 2023, for your student to be registered with ACT to test. {NOTE: This is a HARD deadline.}

How can payments be made?

Payment can be made two ways:

Directions for MySchoolBucks Payment:

1. Login to your MySchoolBucks account. Don't have an account? Click [here](#) for the setup guide.
2. Once you have an account, click [here](#) and it will redirect you directly to the payment page.

Directions for CASH Payment:

1. Put \$50 CASH (exact change) in an envelope labeled "ACT 3/28/23".
2. Have your student turn the money into the front office of their school.

What do I do if my child receives accommodations when testing?

If your student qualifies for accommodated testing, please notify your child's counselor that you are registering so an accommodated test can be requested from ACT.

If I pay and my child is absent is there a makeup?

Students must physically be present on March 28, 2023, to take the PAPER/PENCIL version of the ACT. There will be NO makeup test.
