

## California Assessment of Student Performance and Progress (CAASPP)

California uses the CAASPP system, established in 2014, to measure statewide student proficiency in grade-level English Language Arts (ELA) and Mathematics standards. This year's results represent the first opportunity to understand fully how student learning in California has been affected by the pandemic.

### what you should know


- Students in grades 3-8 and 11 take the CAASPP test once a year each spring; it is an end-of-year snapshot of student learning.
- CA suspended the tests in 2020 due to the pandemic so spring 2022 is the first time that students in grades 3-8 have participated in the assessment.
- Due to the multi-year pause, coupled with challenges and disruptions to learning presented by the pandemic, the state has determined that data from the 2021-22 assessments will be considered "baseline data" for measuring student progress moving forward.

#### English Language Arts

 91% of participating students performed within Tiers 1-2 in the area of reading, an increase of 3% from 2020-21

### Mathematics

 92% of participating students performed within Tiers 1-2 in the area of mathematics, an increase of 5% from 2020-21



#### **Tier 1 (green)** within-to-above grade level; students benefit from core classroom instruction

**Tier 2 (yellow)** approaching grade level; candidates for targeted small group interventions

Tier 3 (red) below grade level; candidates for intensive individual intervention

**Note:** The graphs above demonstrate student progress toward grade-level proficiency in English Language Arts and Math in the 2021-2022 school year. The goal is to increase the number of students in Tier 1 and decrease the number of students in Tier 3.

## **iReady Diagnostic**

The CAASPP system provides an end-of-year snapshot of student progress towards meeting grade-level standards. It does not provide the school district with in-depth, individualized student data throughout the year. LBUSD uses iReady Diagnostic assessments 2-3 times a year for students in grades K-10 and other assessment tools to measure student learning, customize learning plans, and identify students who may benefit from additional support or more rigorous learning opportunities.

#### Addressing COVID-19 impacts on mental health and learning:

- Dedicated math and literacy interventionists to provide additional support and learning recovery to students demonstrating a need
- Increased school counselors to reduce counselor per pupil ratio
- Added school social workers and a coordinator of family engagement to increase access to mental health supports and community-based resources
- For students in grades 6-12, incorporated tutorial/advisory classes into the bell schedule to increase points of connection between students and staff
- Introduced a Teacher on Special Assignment (TOSA) for Visual and Performing Arts (VAPA) to design and implement lessons for students
- Full-day summer enrichment program offered free of cost to all grades 1-12
- Intensive summer academic intervention program for grades 1-8
- Summer credit recovery program for grades 9-12

- CDE organized the CTE Model Curriculum Standards into CA's 15 high-employing industry sectors
