**7. RECONVENE IN PUBLIC: REPORT ON CLOSED SESSION ACTION**

The Board reconvened at 6:38 p.m. President Hall reported that during Closed Session the Board of Trustees of the Oxnard Union High School District voted 5 to 0 for the acceptance of a settlement agreement of \$187,500 regarding employee #4000; Case Number 56-2021-00560079-CU-WM-VTA. President Hall announced that during Closed Session the Board of Trustees of the Oxnard Union High School District voted 5 to 0 for the District to join other California School Districts and Public Agencies in class action litigation brought against JUUL Labs related to smokeless tobacco and its impact on youth. The motion was made by Trustee Herrera and seconded by Trustee Botello.

Matthew Fairchild has demonstrated the most remarkable turnaround in behavior as he now has the most positive, enthusiastic and hardworking student in the class. No matter what task, he responds with “yay!” or “awesome!.” whether it is classwork, working in our flower shop, cooking or taking out the trash. Matthew works with Rafael (our campus maintenance/custodian) daily and is able to learn each job he’s given quickly. There is no doubt that Matthew will continue to develop his skills and become an excellent employee. Teachers are excited for what the future holds for him.

Sonnie Arkangel Urias is in his second year at Anacapa Adult Transition. He has an infectious smile and a profound sense of humor. Sonnie participates with enthusiasm and skill in the Unified Sports program and has grown tremendously as a person and student the past two years. He has worked at, and mastered, several vocational job sites. Due to his ability to learn vocational tasks quickly and his desire to be employed, Sonnie was one of the first round picks to start training at McDonalds and his manager there has already requested Sonnie to work independently, without a paraeducator, so he can be evaluated. Sonnie is on his way to being an independent, productive young man.

Jose Luis Ramirez is in his second year at Anacapa Adult Transition. Upon arrival at the school, he was very shy and nervous but has come out of his shell and is now thriving. Jose participates in the unified sports teams and does quite well, participated in off campus training sites at Goodwill and Walgreens and was able to get a job, on his own, at Jack in the Box. Jose has a kind heart and is always willing to help staff or his peers whenever help is needed.

B. Consideration of Approval of Allowable Expenditures Utilizing the Arts, Music, and Instructional Materials Discretionary Block Grant

Trustees asked Dr. McCoy to supply them with further data information; therefore, this item was tabled to the December 14, 2022 Board meeting and no action was taken.

*Tabled*

- Dr. McCoy stated he informed Principals and Music Directors that there would be an allocation out of the block grant monies but confirmed the amounts with cabinet staff.
- This block grant is a one-time funding source from AB 185, not Prop 28.
- Dr. McCoy affirmed that these block grant monies can be spent on arts, music and instructional materials but they can also be spent on other items. He also added the only place art and music is mentioned in this grant is in the title.
- Trustees requested Dr. McCoy to inform them of the differences between AB185 and Prop 28 before they can make a decision to move forward.
- Prop 28 has an initial per student allocation but the final rules wouldn't be received until January 2023. The department of education would take the proposition that was passed and give a student allocation amount plus the enhancement for students with great needs, OUHSD serves approximately 68%.
- Proposition 28 monies are ongoing, but only if the established commitment is met this school year.
- The expenditures set this school year towards Art and Music would include the current level of staffing, the current level of department budgets, the current level of LCAP and Title IV Art and Music funding combined. OUHSD wouldn't be allowed to spend less than the current expenditures plus \$1,000,000 in future years.
- Trustees requested an itemized list of what the monies are actually allocated to. They would also like to know how this grant relates to Prop 28, along with the initial plans for Prop 28.

## 15. STAFF REPORTS and BOARD DISCUSSION

### A. DSHS #4

Assignment-CTE: Hospitality, Tourism and Recreation, as presented. Seconded by Trustee Herrera and carried unanimously by a vote of 5:0.

Motion: Trustee Edmonds moved to approve the permission to hire: *Site Administrative Secretary*, as presented. Seconded by Trustee Botello and carried unanimously with a vote of 5:0.

- WIOAII grant funds, an ongoing grant, will be used to pay for this position.

Staff shared ongoing updates of DSHS which is scheduled to open Fall 2023. Updates included but were not limited to leadership team, educational programs, MC3 meeting update and ongoing community updates.

- Dr. Leon introduced her leadership team.
- The MC3 is not specific to one particular trade or pathway as it has nine units that can be integrated into any manufacturing, product innovation design or building construction trades.
- Ms. Phillippe has reached out to local labor unions and organizations by holding a skilled trade summit last year for OUHSD. Every local union representative attended. An in-service was held for Special Ed Teachers and counselors. This will take place again in April 2023.
- DSHS doesn't have a set bell schedule at this time but hopes to have some level of discussion in early 2023.
- Carina Casillas, SLIFE/ELD Department Chair, has experience as an ELD Department Chair at HHS, has just opened the SLIFE Program at OHS and she is already attending district ELD meetings and already working with the ELD Director. Dr. Leon is also working with Director Lupe Reyes-Castillo to see who her ELD students would be and what needs they would have.
- Natalie Dempsey, SpEd Department Chair, is currently a mild/moderate teacher at HHS and Co-Department Chair; therefore, she has experience in attending district meetings to understand the district overview.
- Dr. Leon informs parents of what it means to be a student and what their hopes and dreams are for their student before enrolling them into an educational program so she knows what program to place them in.
- Dr. Leon stated the DSHS student population can be up to 86% English Language. She is looking to focus on the International Baccalaureate piece because the focus is global perspectives and multiple languages.
- Trustees asked Dr. Leon to bring back information at her next update about the methodology she is using to contact local employers and if they're engaged in the dialogue for hiring CTE teachers. Trustees would like to know the difficulties of hiring CTE Teachers and finding that capacity, where's the workforce and what's driving the county workforce. Dr. Leon plans to share data with Dr. McCoy around the availability of opportunities within the county looking at the labor market.

### B. EL Plan

Staff provided an update on the implementation of the 2022-2025 Three Year English Learner Plan. On May 11, 2022 a three year English Learner plan was presented to the Trustees with disaggregated data for all our special populations subgroups. This presentation included graduation rates along with A-G completion rates. The intent of the plan is to increase ELPAC scores, College and Career readiness, and graduation rates. In order to support our At Promise students and Creating Prosperity through Equity, Inquiry, and Wellness, OUHSD Departments and staff members need to collaborate together to support our At Promise students. This staff report will focus on English language learners and the status on the implementation of the plan.

- Trustee Sher asked for an information tab to be put on the district website for OUHSD Welcome Centers.
- Mr. Adams acknowledged OUHSD Principals, and their site teams, for the work they do to make English Learner (EL) students a priority on their campuses.
- Trustee Sher asked Principals to build a wish list for their sites to see if Trustees can fulfill them.
- Educational Services Directors work directly with site administrators for particular needs such as teachers or counseling staff. Ms. Reyes-Castillo mentioned there would be a training on November 17 to address goals and school plans for student achievement.
- Dr. McCoy reassured Trustees that there is a monthly district level formal connection and now the ELLRT teams are the place where the site and district expertise come together. Quarterly meetings are the start but monthly is the goal for this team.
- Ms. Reyes-Castillo expressed her wish to accomplish connecting with Directors in order to coordinate, collaborate, and strategize on how we can incorporate ELs in our respective areas.
- Trustees requested an EL year-end evaluation of where we're at, data from last year for comparison.
- Through the work of Categorical Counselors, Wellness Specialists, General Ed Counselors and Administrators, the same tiered support is provided for ELs across the board along with all of the rest of the OUHSD students.
- The EL Teacher on Special Assignment is on medical leave at this time and we can't replace a person in the Human Resources position that is currently employed. Dr. McCoy stated he is looking into asking the EL veteran teachers at the sites to fill-in some of the gaps being experienced at this time.
- The HHS Welcome Center is not currently in use due to construction but it should be up in March. The services are still being provided though.
- There is funding available through the Learning Recovery Block Grant to open other Welcome Centers in the district. As DSHS comes online there will be more availability of class space at each of the sites to implement the programs and have a facility that is successful to our community. These would possibly be available in fall of next year.
- Mr. Adams is working with Human Resources to develop a bilingual paraeducator job description. Once this has been approved there will be a recruitment process to fulfill this particular role.
- There was one breakout session per session that was dedicated to ELD/SLIFE at the October Professional Development day. There is discussion of the ELD/SLIFE teams making staff presentations at their site staff meetings. Trustees would like this area promoted more to bring to everyone's attention.

Trustees thanked Mr. Adams and Ms. Reyes-Castillo for their presentation.

Staff and officers from Oxnard PD shared updates on OUHSD's partnerships with community law enforcement agencies and the School Resource Officer (SRO) program. OUHSD teams collaborate with partner law enforcement agencies with SRO activities that include but not limited to; site traffic flow, building relationships with staff and students, career and safety classroom presentations, wellness checks and home visits and participation in CTE programs like DRAGG and Law Academy.

- Attended the Westminster Free Clinic celebration where Assemblymember Steve Bennett, Assemblymember Monique Limón, Assemblymember Jacqui Irwin and County Supervisor Vianey Lopez were there to celebrate the \$1.5 million received for the clinic.
- Thanked everyone who voted during this election season, especially the youth vote ages 18-25.
- Looking forward to working with our partners after OUHSD students graduate, post-secondary options, continue to vote.
- Gave shoutouts to Senerey and Teodoro for the work they've done to promote the various Dia de los Muertos celebrations that took place at various OUHSD campuses, publication of the financial literacy advertised on the district website and the DRAGG program that was publicized through social media by various community leaders.
- Thanked the West Ventura County Business Alliance for their participation in the mock interviews.
- Thanked the Gold Coast Carpenter's Union for initiating a warm coat drive for OUHSD students this winter.
- Gave a shoutout to City Councilmember Gabe Teran for his work with OUHSD around the dangers of the use of fentanyl, opioid and naloxone.


