# What is a Title I?

- Title I is the major component of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA) and the largest federal assistance program for our nation's schools.
  - The goal of Title I is a higher quality of education for every child.
  - The program serves millions of children in elementary and secondary schools each year.
  - Shoals Elementary School is a Schoolwide Title I school.
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# SES Schoolwide Program

- Reading and math fluency
- Reading comprehension in all subjects

## What programs/supports are in place to help my child?

# Purchases Using Title I funding

- General Supplies such as:
    - Paper
    - Reading and Math Books
  - Aide Salaries
  - Summer IREAD remediation (tutoring)
  - Professional Development for teachers
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# Parents' Rights







- Be involved and request regular meetings to express your opinions and concerns.
  - Be provided information on your child's level of achievement on local assessments (NWEA) and state tests, such as Ilearn and IREAD.
  - Request and receive information on the qualifications of your child's teacher
  - Be informed if your child is taught by a non-certified teacher for four or more consecutive weeks. (We currently have no students in this situation).
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# What is required by law for parental involvement?

As outlined in the Parent Involvement Policy:

- Involve parents in an organized, ongoing way
  - Provide parents with the information they need to help their child/children succeed in school
  - Convene an annual meeting to inform parents of the school's Title 1 program
  - Offer a flexible number of parent meetings
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# What opportunities does the school provide for parental involvement?

- Parent meetings, conferences, school events and workshops
  - Communication through email, newsletters, website, Facebook
  - Sharing educational resources such as websites and strategies to reinforce skills at home
  - SPA and classroom/school-wide volunteering
  - Parental input: Title 1 meetings, surveys
  - Collaborating with the community-business partnerships


