GRADE POINT AVERAGE

The grade point average on a transcript reports both a weighted and unweighted GPA if a student has taken an AP or IB course. Weighted grades are calculated on a 5.0 scale. A "G" grade indicates a passing grade in a pass/fail option. An "S" grade indicates the course was retaken for grade replacement. The lowest grade one can earn and still receive credit is a D-.
