

COVID-19 Vaccination Requirement for NCSD Facility Use & Community Partners

Pursuant to OAR 333-019-1030, beginning October 18, 2021, North Clackamas School District (NCSD) requires the following groups (including any employees, volunteers or agents over the age of 16) to be fully vaccinated against Covid-19:

- Renters who conduct in person activities with NCSD students or other minors at NCSD facilities. This includes indoor and outdoor facilities.
- Partnering organizations who conduct activities or provide services in NCSD schools and have direct or indirect contact with students.

Renters or partnering organizations within the above criteria must complete the [2021 COVID Waiver](#).

The following exceptions to the renter or partnering organization vaccination requirement do not require vaccination or completion of the [2021 COVID Waiver](#):

- Renters or partners who conduct activities at school sites but will not have direct or indirect contact with students or minors. (e.g.- adult only recreational athletics.)
- Partnering organizations who are not on or in district facilities and do not otherwise have direct or indirect contact with students;
- Individuals making deliveries (e.g., parcel delivery) and emergency service providers (e.g., paramedics and other emergency personnel, utility workers, emergency repair persons.)
- Individuals working outside on school sites but not working with students are not subject to the vaccination mandate as long as they maintain significant distance from students at all times.

FAQs

What is “indirect contact?”

OAR 333-019-1030 does not define “indirect contact.” Please see above examples for guidance of what constitutes indirect contact.

What does fully vaccinated mean?

Per the CDC, you are considered fully vaccinated:

- Two weeks after your second dose in a two-dose vaccine series, such as the Pfizer or Moderna vaccines; or
- Two weeks after a single-dose vaccine, such as Johnson & Johnson vaccine

Will there be a requirement to get booster shots, or a third COVID vaccine dose after receiving two Pfizer or Moderna doses, or a second Johnson & Johnson dose?

At this time there is no provision in the rule for additional doses or booster shots. With reasonable notice, the District reserves the right to require additional doses or boosters.

May an individual opt out of the vaccination requirement for medical or religious reasons?

Yes. Individuals may work with their organization if they qualify for an exception due to medical conditions or sincerely held religious belief. Organizations must still complete the [2021 COVID Waiver](#) and should retain the OHA documentation for [religious](#) and [medical](#) exemptions.

Who is responsible for obtaining proof of vaccination or exemption?

Each organization will be responsible for obtaining proof of vaccination and maintaining this documentation in accordance with state and federal laws for two years, pursuant to OAR 339-019-1030. Organizations will be required to attest to abiding by this Oregon Health Authority requirement and provide the proof of vaccination to OHA upon request.

How long must I maintain the vaccination records?

The vaccination documentation and documentation of medical and religious exceptions must be:

- (a) Maintained in accordance with applicable federal and state laws;
- (b) Maintained for at least two years; and
- (c) Provided to the Oregon Health Authority upon request.

Do I need to submit a picture/photocopy of my vaccine card or my volunteers'/agents'/employees' vaccine cards or other records to NCSD?

No, not at this time.

Will weekly testing be an alternative option?

No, not at this time.

Are faith based organizations subject to this requirement?

Yes, if faith based organizations meet the criteria above (ie-offer any programs for youth or host youth on site), they are required to follow this rule.
