


Washington School Mission Statement



Every year during the month of January W.E.S. celebrates New Jersey's No-name calling Week, January 17-20, with Kindness and Teamwork Week. We conduct activities and lessons that promote teamwork, collaboration, and the art of compromise. Our school family will enjoy a school spirit week where there is something special planned for each day.

During our monthly **Leadership Buddy Activity**, Buddy Leaders in 3-5th grades will work with their K-2 Little Buddies on teamwork and fairness by playing boards games or cooperative building with legos. Younger buddies will learn the importance of fairness and good sportsmanship.

<u>Curriculum Connections</u>: Our Physical Education classes will infuse the importance of teamwork in accomplishing the goals of a group. In Art, 5th grade is collaborating to create a positive word wall through paper tye dye and printmaking. K-4 will create kindness links in Art for our schoolwide display—"Linked together by Kindness and Love". In Music, students will learn songs about Kindness for a schoolwide sing along.

Research has found that children who perform acts of kindness and prosocial behaviors on a regular basis tend to have higher self-esteem and a sense of self-efficacy.
