

A Word from our **President**

"Something old, something new; something borrowed, something blue" is the ditty that describes a bride's traditional accoutrement. If you drop "borrowed/blue," you catch something of the "magic" of Verbum Dei. The Jesuits assumed responsibility for Verbum Dei in 2000 at the request of then-Archbishop, Cardinal Roger Mahony. Jesuits were "new" to Verbum but the school was an "old" and trusted member of the Watts community. The newly arrived Jesuits brought to Verbum Dei a 500 year old tradition and a reputation as "the school masters of Europe" that traces back to the sixteenth century.

A shorthand way to talk about the Jesuit tradition is education for information and transformation. Jesuit education is about students acquiring the knowledge and skills needed to succeed in college and live satisfying lives, while contributing to the betterment of society. Jesuit education is not just about students—it is about them--and about what they will do with that education for others. Our current experience with the pandemic, the economic collapse, the social unrest and the failure of leadership can leave no doubt about the nation's need for persons who will look beyond the concerns of any individual or group to promote the common good of all.

In Jesuit education, "information" is not just facts, figures and formulas, but also self-knowledge that generates confidence and freedom that supports our students' transformation into the full, unique persons that God calls them to be. A Verbum Dei student's reflections about his tendency to give-up demonstrates learning that reaches beyond history, literature, math and science to include that deeper knowledge of oneself that promotes positive personal development and lays a solid foundation for life. He writes:

"All my life I've given up. Whether it's in sports or even academics. When things get too hard, I tend to run away and not have to deal with it altogether. I look at my parents and grandparents and see nothing but perseverance...I've always been scared to fail. I don't want to come home one day and my parents will be disappointed in me.

However, recently I'm noticing, what good is it to give up? What do I get out of that? I'd rather fail and say I tried than wonder my whole life about 'what could've been."

I want you to think of your contributions to Verbum Dei as I do: less about maintaining an institution and more about transforming boys into competent, self-confident young men empowered by their Jesuit education to pursue their dreams and make a difference in the world. Thank you for your generous support of Verbum Dei Jesuit High School's efforts to inform and transform the next generation of leaders. You're partnering with the great, longstanding tradition that is Jesuit education.

Even with the challenging year, Verbum Dei has been extremely blessed. The Class of 2020 continued the tradition of hard work and perseverance right up to a non-tradition drive-through graduation day. On average the Class of 2020 scholars submitted 26 college applications each. This resulted in acceptances to 6 University of California's, 7- Catholic, 8- Historically Black Colleges and Universities, 11- Jesuit, and 16- California States Universities along with a host of private and public universities nationwide. Not to be outdone, the Class of 2021 and Class of 2022 have the highest number of students applying and enrolled in our honors program in recent years. And our incoming freshmen of 75 are more academically prepared and diverse than their predecessors.

As you are aware, Verbum Dei is not only about academics. Our mission is to create the next generation of Spirit-filled leaders, and our students are well on their way. Their performance in the Corporate Work Study Program and Christian Service programs are all evidence of that fact, even in these particularly challenging times. Our students are presenting, creating, and performing in ways we could never have




