From the principal's desk

Dear Parents and Guardians:

I hope that everyone enjoyed their winter break and had an opportunity to spend time with their friends and families. January is a very busy month for students and staff. We will begin the month by starting the course registration process for our students. Each student's 2023-2024 educational program will be created through various meetings with teachers, counselors, parents, and administrators. As this process gets started, our students will begin preparing for midterm examinations and the conclusion of the second marking period/first semester.

Our course selection process encompasses two months as is designed to ensure that your students are placed in the appropriate academic courses for the upcoming school year. Parkland High School offers a rigorous and standards aligned curriculum for students of all ability levels. For the 2023-2024 school year our students will receive a course offerings menu unparalleled in its diversity and quality.

Students currently in grades 9, 10 and 11 will receive their course registration books along with live virtual instruction to walk them through the course registration process during an extended homeroom period on Tuesday, January 3, 2023. A link to a virtual presentation with specific information from administration, counseling and academic departments regarding the course registration process will be emailed to parents of these students on Tuesday, January 3.

Similar to years past, PHS utilizes online registration. Students will use Home Access Center to see teacher recommendations and choose their courses for next year. Students should complete their initial course registration selections by Monday January 16. Throughout the months of January and February counselors will meet with your student during English classes to finalize the course selection process.

The high school and middle schools use a team approach to provide course registration information to our current 8th grade students and parents. Activities involving career inventories will take place at the middle schools in early January to aid our students in selecting a career pathway. Course registration books will be provided to all Parkland 8th grade students on Wednesday, January 25, 2023 but can be accessed online now by going to this link.

All parents of 8th grade students at Orefield and Springhouse are invited to and should attend a Parent Meeting for Course Registration for the Class of 2027 on Thursday, January 5, 2023 at 7 PM in the Parkland High School Auditorium. All 8th grade students must submit their 2023-2024 course requests online through Home Access Center by Friday, February 3, 2023. Throughout the months of January and February, teachers, counselors, and administration will assist your child with the course selection process.

Students will be taking midterm examinations from January 12 through January 20. Students will take their Science midterm in class on Thursday or Friday January 12 or 13. Students will take their remaining midterms on Wednesday, January 18 (English and Math) and Thursday, January 19 (Social Studies and World Language). On those two days, the high school will be running a half day schedule with dismissal occurring at 11 AM. On Friday, January 20, we will have a 1 PM dismissal.

Our winter sports teams are off to an outstanding start to their seasons. It may be the off-season for some sports, but you would be impressed with the dedication our athletes show while training. The gymnasiums and weight rooms are used every night in preparation for next season's goals.

Finally, congratulations to our music programs on their wonderful winter concert performances this past month. Having live performances and audiences was such a great reminder of why we value the arts here in Parkland. The exceptional quality of their concerts showcase the talents of our students, their incredible work ethic, and the passion shared by our music educators and students. Happy New Year!

COURSE REGISTRATION 8th - 11th Graders

The registration and scheduling process for the 2023-2024 school year begins at Parkland High School during the month of January.

Throughout the next few months, students will be selecting courses that best meet their academic goals, administrators will be calculating student enrollments, staffing assignments will be prepared, and a master schedule will be created for next school year.

To begin the registration process, all students, 8th through 11th grades, will receive a copy of the **2023-2024 Parkland High School Course Study Guide.** This is a valuable resource and reference guide for students and parents selecting a program of study for the next school year.

Several informational meetings will be held for parents and students throughout the month of January to highlight new course offerings, review graduation requirements and provide guidelines for selecting appropriate course levels.



Planning your child's program of study is one of the most important tasks completed each school year. Counselors, faculty, and administrators will work closely together to guide your child through this important process.

COLLEGE ADMISSIONS TESTING

Juniors interested in taking the SAT should select and register for a March, May, June and/or August test.

Registration for the SAT is now available online at <u>www.sat.org/register</u>.

Juniors may also want to consider the ACT as a college admission test option. The ACT is offered in February, April and June in the Lehigh Valley.

PHS Debate team earned a 15-1 season record and the top seed position at EPC Finals debating NSDA's 2022-2023 Policy Topic: The United States federal government should substantially increase its security cooperation with the North Atlantic Treaty Organization in one or more of the following areas: artificial intelligence, biotechnology, cybersecurity.

At EPC Finals, the team of **Reva Gandhi**, **Vishruth Hanumaihgari**, **Varun Pandian** and **Ethan Silver** successfully debated three rounds: arguing *Affirmative* against Emmaus in Round 1, arguing *Negative* against Bethlehem Catholic in Round 2, and arguing *Affirmative* against Pocono Mountain West to win the 2022-2023 EPC Debate Championship.

If a student is taking more than one core subject during a testing period (example: 2 sciences, AP Chemistry and AP Biology), students will take one exam during the assigned testing period and the other during makeup testing in the Auxiliary Gym on Friday, January 20. Students should work with their teachers to decide which exam they will take on the testing day and which one they will take on Friday during makeup testing.



STUDENT EXPECTATIONS

• Students must be on time for their exams. No extra time is given in instances where students are late for an exam.

• In instances where a student must complete an online midterm exam, students will be required to bring their charged Chromebooks to school. Teachers will communicate with students if they need their Chromebooks for exams. Loaner Chromebooks will *not* be available to students, and so students should plan accordingly.

• If a student is absent from school on the day of an exam, please provide a doctor's note for the absence as is stated in the Student Handbook. Please also contact the PHS Attendance Office at 610-351-5655 to report the absence.



Students must report to school for the full day on:

Wednesday, January 18 and Thursday, January 19, students only report if they have midterm exams. Some classes do not have required midterm exams or have a required project instead of an exam. Teachers will communicate the exam expectations and formats prior to the exam dates.



Flu Season is Here

As the new year begins, the flu season continues to be in full swing through the month of April.

It is recommended that your student receive their flu vaccine at this time. Please check with your doctor to schedule a vaccination.

Physical Forms are Due

Juniors should return their completed physical forms to the Health Room as soon as possible.

Immunization Requirement

The Meningitis Vaccine is required on or after the day your child turns 16 years old. Students will be required to have this immunization before the first day of their senior year of high school. The grade 11 grade physical is a good time o be sure this immunization is completed.

Guidelines for Sending Your Child to School

Please keep your children home from school (even if they have a test or sporting event) if they are experiencing any of the following symptoms:

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- * Fever of 100 degrees or more * Vomiting * Diarrhea
- * Severe head cold * Persistent cough * Severe sore throat

Three Key Elements to Safe Winter Driving

We all know that winter weather creates many hazards on the road, but do you know the three key elements to safe winter driving? As adults, many of us may take them for granted but they may not be as obvious to teens. Use the local weather forecast to talk with your teen/young adult about this regularly and in all types of weather:



Prepare for the Trip

Ask your child to give examples of how they can prepare for a trip. If your child is able to identify key points, then they were listening in theory class. If they have difficulty, give them examples, including but not limited to the following:

Check the Fluid Levels - Something as simple as adding windshield wiper fluid can make the difference in good vs. poor visibility. This supports the statistic that 90% of our driving information comes from what we see.



Check the Condition of Your Tires - Cold temperatures cause air in your tires to contract, so even new tires may need an extra pound or two of air pressure. Do the penny trick to measure tread depth. If you insert a penny with Lincoln's head down into the tire tread and you do not see the top of his head, then you have safe tread. If you see his forehead, replace your tires. If you think new tires are expensive, think about the cost of an accident. If your tread is not worn out enough to warrant a tire replacement, but your tires are not new, remind your child to slow down sooner and brake sooner to stop safely.



Protect Yourself

Wear Your Seatbelt - Make sure your passengers wear seatbelts as well. Did you know that you are 23 times more likely to have a fatal accident if someone is thrown from a vehicle? Avoid Distractions and Fatigued Driving - Both of these mistakes resemble those of an impaired driver. Common errors include inconsistent speed, drifting in their lane, failing to obey traffic signs and more.

Have Warm Clothes and Accessories - The chance of being stopped in traffic for extended periods increases with freezing temperatures so you may want to keep blankets and warm gear in your vehicle, along with a bottle of water and granola bar in your glovebox.



Prevent Crashes on the Road

Slow Down - Remind your child that the speed limit is the maximum safe speed when all six conditions of driving are favorable. Weather conditions often warrant slowing down, but when there are conditions such as sleet or freezing rain, slowing down is a necessity. Even better, stay off the road. Use Headlights - Light conditions are less than favorable during winter months. Using your headlights when the skies are gray will help other cars see you sooner.

Increase Following Distance - Increasing your following distance, reducing your speed and braking sooner any time the roads are wet, and even more when roads are slushy or snowy will go a long way in preventing an accident.


