What is eStart? eStart is an online dual credit program, offered through the Community College System o NH, that enables high school students to take community college courses for dual high school AND college credit.

Who is eligible to take an eStart course? Sophomores, Juniors or Seniors.

When do the courses run? Fall & Spring semesters. The spring semester dates are January 17 - May 6, 2022

What is the cost? \$150 per course + textbooks, however, STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering & Math) and CTE (Career Technical Education) courses are free.

Are courses in-person or online? Courses offered through the eStart program are 100% online college courses.



Meredith Rotary Youth Exchange Program Seeks Host Families

If you have room in your home and space in your heart, please consider serving as a host family for our Rotary international exchange student for school year 2023-24 or beyond. Incoming students live with two families that will host for five months each, one from mid-to-late August through mid-January, and the second family from mid-January through late-June. Single-person homes to families with multiple siblings can all serve as loving and learning experiences for anexchange student. And you, in return, will also experience love and learning, insight and new understanding that can expand your world in many ways. Our exchange student will likely be enrolled as a Junior or Senior at ILHS and range from 16 to 18 years in age. They are here to try all sorts of new experiences of life in New Hampshire, including a loving host family experience. Essentially, he or she would become like a son or daughter to you and as a brother or sister to you own children while in your home. You would provide the same for them as you would your own, although the Rotary club provides a monthly allowance to the student for personal expenses. Even though a student may be old enough to drive, exchange students in our program are prohibited from driving, so transportation would be part of their needs. We have several club members who can help with that as well, if necessary. On a personal note, as the Youth Exchange Officer for the Meredith Rotary club for the past twelve years, and being deeply involved in the program not only at our club level, but District level as well, I can tell you from all these experiences over the past twelve years that getting to know these amazing young people is fun, educational, and mostly it's incredibly inspiring. It is also how we all can contribute to a world with better understanding and respect between people and cultures. The need to find host families is on-going. 
