Meredith Rotary Seeking Students for Youth Exchange Long Term Program

Rotary Youth Exchange is the opportunity of a lifetime for more than 8,000 students who participate each year. By sharing your own culture and embracing a new one, you help foster global understanding—and learn a great deal about yourself and your home country in the process. As an exchange student, you live in another country for a full school year, living with 2-3 families in the town where you attend the local school. In order to apply for this program, you must: 1) be 15 to 18.5 years of age by August 1st of the year you are traveling, 2) be in the upper 3rd of your class standing, 3) attend ILHS, and 4) have received the COVID vaccine. The cost of the program typically runs from about \$3800 to \$5400, which includes application fees, insurance, passport, visa fees, and airline tickets. Host clubs provide a monthly stipend. Additional costs include Rotary sponsored trips, if you choose to attend. Students typically participate during their junior or "gap" year, but occasionally their senior year as well. Scholarships are available for highly qualified applicants, based on financial need. Students who wish to participate during the 2023-24 academic school year should apply by April 30, 2023.

FRANKLIN PIERCE UNIVERSITY IS COMMITTED TO OFFERING NEW HAMPSHIRE RESIDENTS AN EDUCATION THAT IS AFFORDABLY WITHIN REACH.

Through the **Pierce Promise New Hampshire** program, Granite State residents may be eligible for **FREE TUITION AND FEES** toward their undergraduate degree.

*How do I qualify for Pierce Promise NH?

- Be a first-time, full-time, incoming student for the fall 2023 semester.
- Be a resident of New Hampshire and plan to be a residential student at Franklin Pierce's Rindge Campus. Students who choose to commute will be eligible for a prorated discount.
- · Earn a 3.0 or higher high school cumulative GPA.
- File the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and demonstrate a household gross income of under \$60,000.

Pierce Promise New Hampshire Frequently Asked Questions

Are there other expenses that I will need to pay to attend Franklin Pierce University?

YES! You will need to pay for room, board, books and other supplies. The average cost to live on campus and a full meal plan for a freshman residential student is \$15,000. Books and supplies vary, but students should plan to spend \$1,100 per year. In addition, personal and transportation costs average \$1,000 per year.

What if tuition costs rise during your time at Franklin Pierce?

The Pierce Promise NH program will cover all tuition and fees, even if they increase, as long as the qualifiers are met.

Does this award cover all four years of my education?

YES! Provided your family's AGI (Adjusted Gross Income) reported on the FAFSA remains under \$60,000, the Pierce Promise Program will cover tuition and fees for all four years of attendance at Franklin Pierce University as long as you maintain a 2.0 GPA. If your AGI changes over time, the award will be prorated.

Can I use the private scholarship I received to help pay for my room and board expenses?

YES! Any private scholarship or grant may be applied to your room, board and book expenses.

Do I have to sign up for the program?

NO! You will automatically be considered for eligibility upon acceptance to Franklin Pierce and receipt of your *FAFSA* (Free Application for Federal Student Aid). If you are eligible, the amount awarded by Pierce Promise will be illustrated in your financial aid award letter.

Cooking Matters for Families (Adults & Children Ages 6 and up)
Wednesday evenings from 6:00-8:00pm, beginning January 11, 2023 (6 Weeks)
OFFERED IN PERSON ONLY, NO ZOOM OPTION FOR THIS CLASS

Cooking & nutrition class, participants will receive groceries each week to practice their cooking skills. Topics covered will include making meals more nutritious, tips for grocery shopping, healthy & kid-friendly recipes, cooking skills for the family, & much more! Food will be prepared in class each week. *Dinner will be served during class at 6pm*.

Cooperative Parenting & Divorce

January 11-February 2, 2023. Class meets twice weekly on Wednesdays & Thursdays from 6:00-8:00pm (4 weeks) This program helps separated/divorced parents shield their children from parental conflict. Parents learn to guide their children through the process of recovery while establishing a cooperative long-term relationship with the other parent. This program educates parents on the impact their conflict has on their children, and teaches parents the practical skills they need to manage anger, increase impulse control, resolve conflict and talk to each other without arguing. While coparents are welcome to take this class together, it is not required. For participants who attend in person, dinner will be served during class at 6pm.

<u>Understanding Children's Growth & Development—A Nurturing Skills Module</u> January 12-February 16, 2023. Daytime and Evening Sessions Available! Thursdays 10:00-11:30am—*OR*— Thursdays 6:30-8:00pm (6 weeks)

This Nurturing Skills module focuses on creating a nurturing environment that stimulates children's overall healthy development. Topics covered include brain development, developmental milestones, creating nurturing routines, and encouraging a growth mindset. For participants who attend in person, dinner will be served at 6pm.

Parenting with Resilience

January 17-February 21, 2023. Class meets Tuesdays from 6:30-8:00pm (6 weeks)

Learn about Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACE's) and how trauma can effect children's development and behavior. Caregivers will learn strategies to build their own ability to persevere through tough times, as well as techniques for encouraging resilience in children. For participants who attend in person, dinner will be served at 6pm.

Active Parenting of Teens

January 17-February 21, 2023. Class meets Tuesdays from 6:00-8:00pm (6 weeks)

Active Parenting of Teens will give parents the guidance and support needed to turn the challenges of raising a teenager into opportunities for growth. Topics include: methods of respectful discipline, skills for clear, honest communication, strategies to prevent risky behavior, how to be an encouraging parent, and issues such as teens on-line, bullying and depression. For participants who attend in person, dinner will be served during class at 6pm.

Nurture Hope

February 8-April 5, 2023. Class meets Wednesdays from 6:30-8:00pm (8 weeks)

This series is designed for parents with children who have special needs and health challenges, giving them an opportunity to explore their hopes and fears, develop effective parenting skills, enhance communication, develop strategies for facing challenges and recognize opportunities for celebration. For participants who attend in person, dinner will be served at 6pm. *There will be no class on March 1st*
