Reporting to the Upper School Director, the Upper School Counselor is a faculty member who will assist students in their social-emotional development, academic growth, and help them to grow in grace and wisdom to become leaders of character. Counselors work with students one-on-one and in group settings. This position also jointly manages a small advisory group of students with the other counselor and works closely with the other advisors of that grade level to support those students and to implement our activities for that grade around character education and social-emotional learning.

Responsibilities:

- Respond to the emotional needs of students in one-on-one and group sessions.
- Partner with parents, teachers, and administrators to meet the needs of the students.
- Collaborate with the other counselors to implement social-emotional programming.
- Plan for and conduct standardized testing for students with accommodations.
- Assist students with academic planning, accountability, and/or organization.
- Teach a variety of skills including social skills, study skills, and test-taking skills.
- Counsel students with personal, social, disciplinary, and behavioral issues.
- Promptly notify appropriate authorities of any reports or suspicions of abuse or neglect.
- Collaborate with other educators, parents, and students to develop, review, renew, and/or modify education plans for students who qualify.
- Seek professional development opportunities to focus on improving student development and continued growth as a counselor.
- Mentor a small advisor group of students and implement advisement programming
- Perform other duties as assigned
