215. PROMOTION AND RETENTION

1. Purpose

The Joint Operating Committee recognizes that the emotional, social, physical and educational growth of students will vary and that students should be placed in the educational setting most appropriate to their needs at the various stages of their growth.

It is the policy of the Joint Operating Committee that each student shall be moved forward in a continuous pattern of achievement and growth that corresponds with his/her own development and the system of grade levels and academic standards established for each grade.

SC 1532, Pol. 213

A student shall be promoted when he/she successfully completes the course requirements at the presently assigned level and achieved the academic standards established for the present level, based on the professional judgment of his/her teachers and the results of assessment. This will include that a student must pass three of the four marking periods.

The Executive Director shall develop procedures for promotion and retention of students which assure that every effort will be made to remediate the student's difficulties before he/she is retained participate in the selection process.

The recommendation of the classroom teacher shall be required for promotion or retention of a student.

Parents shall be informed well in advance of the possibility of retention of a student.

The administration shall be assigned the final responsibility for determining the promotion or retention of each student.
