	223. STUDENT USE OF MOTOR VEHICLES
1. Purpose	The Joint Operating Committee (JOC) regards the use of motor vehicles for travel to and from school by students as an assumption of responsibility by parents and students.
2. Authority	The JOC shall permit the use of motor vehicles by secondary students in accordance with school rules, provided that such students are licensed drivers, have parental permission, and have been granted permission by the administration to drive a motor vehicle on school grounds.
	The Joint Operating Committee shall not be responsible for motor vehicles which are lost, stolen, or damaged on school grounds.
	Operation of motorcycles by students is not permitted on Career Center property.
3. Guidelines	The Career Center shall assume no liability for personal injury or property damages arising out of a student who drives or rides to school in a personal vehicle or walks to and from school with or without permission.
	Driving to school is a privilege and may be revoked.
	Example of reasons for revoking a student's driving privilege.
	1. Unsafe Driving
	2. Improper use of the permit
	3. Leaving the building or property without the permission from the main office.
	4. Not parking in the assigned student lot areas.
	5. Poor school attendance/tardiness.

	6. Not enough parking spaces in defined student parking areas.7. Loss of driving privilege for a specified consequence for school misbehavior.
	The transportation of students who become sick or ill during the school day shall be the responsibility of the parent/guardian.
4. Delegation of Responsibility	Parking on school property is permitted only in designated areas. Violators may be ticketed or towed away at the owner's expense.
	The building principal or designee shall develop rules and regulations for operating and parking of bicycles and motor vehicles, in accordance with this policy, and shall disseminate those rules to affected students.
	The building principal or designee shall establish standards for granting permits, which contain the warning that infraction of rules may result in revocation of the permit.
