* SCHOOL summary

The enrollment for 2021-22 is 630 students (of which 162 are seniors) who reside in more than 50 nearby communities. DCDS is a member of MACAC, NACAC, College Board, ACT, NAIS, ISACS and ACCIS.

ACADEMIC requirements

Detroit Country Day School offers academic programs that contribute to the liberal arts education of students. DCDS is also committed to the psychological, social, athletic and aesthetic development of the student. To this end, students are required to earn:

English # 4 years OOO
Fine & Performing Arts # 1 year O
World Language (through level III) # 3 years OOO
History & US Government # 3.5 years OOO
Mathematics # 3 years OOO
Science (1 life science; 1 physical science) # 2 years OOO

Public Speaking (sophomore year) // 1 semester O
Health Education (freshman year) // 1 semester O

ADDITIONAL DIPLOMA requirements

100% of DCDS students participate in community service, clubs, and athletics/performing arts.

White Points are earned for every 5 hours of community service in approved projects; 2 points per year required

Gold Points are earned for each semester of participation in a club or activity; 2 points per year required.

Mission Points (8 total required)

Blue Points are acquired through the participation in DCDS sports, an off campus sport not offered by DCDS, or national caliber sport; 4 points minimum required for graduation (1 point each year).

Silver Points are acquired through the participation in after school non-athletic team activities including theatre, debate, forensics, science fair, and robotics. No minimum requirement.

SCHOOL COVID statement

2019-20 School Year: On March 13, DCDS immediately implemented virtual learning upon the onset of COVID-19. The school moved forward with a combination of synchronous and asynchronous teaching models driven by Canvas, which allowed the school to maintain it's robust curricular offerings and typical evaluative measures (DCDS does not offer pass/fail grades). These courses continued with strong rigor thru May 29, with final grades posted on June 5, 2020.

2020-21 School Year: DCDS opened as scheduled in September and offered both traditional and family selected remote learning. Over 90% chose in-person learning for the entire year. There was a state-issued mandate for remote learning from November 18 through January 11, but no other interruptions.

2021-22 School Year: Academic year begins September 8 with all classes held in-person and no plans to offer remote learning at this time.







INTERNATIONAL BACCALAUREATE program

Detroit Country Day School offers qualified students the opportunity to enroll in the International Baccalaureate (IB) program. The general objectives of the IB are to provide students with a balanced education, to foster critical thinking in all academic disciplines, to facilitate geographic and cultural mobility, and to promote international understanding through a shared academic experience.




