During this time, parents will fill out a brief developmental questionnaire about their child while educators interact with the children to gain information about each child's development in the areas of speech and language, social/emotional, motor, and cognitive. This is also a time for parents to ask questions about their child's skills and about our preschool program. Please bring your child's birth certificate, proof of residency and up to date immunization.

When kids start to go online, whether they're playing multiplayer games, using educational apps, or just following their curiosity on Google, it's important that they understand the basics of online privacy and safety. With some general guidelines around what information is and isn't OK to share, and some help from parents when they're unsure, kids can have fun and learn a lot in the digital world.

#### Check out these 5 tips 2



#### Discuss personal vs. private info.

Talk about the difference between what's OK to share online (favorite color) and what's not (home address).

#### Use privacy settings.

Together, go through the settings on all new apps to make sure you both know what information your kids are sharing. Especially in the beginning, it's better to share very little.

#### Avoid location tracking.

Location-aware apps can be super helpful. But apps that use a device's location to help people find your kid or offer them ads for nearby businesses should be used with caution. Turn them off if you can.

#### Power up passwords.

Work together with kids to help them come up with complex passwords. Think outside the dictionary. Use phrases and special characters that make passwords hard to guess but easy to remember. Remind kids to keep passwords private and change them regularly.

#### Skip quizzes.

Help kids identify and avoid clickbait, quizzes, special offers, and anything that asks for personal or private information. This helps keep information secure and devices safe. You can still get free at home Covid-19 tests https://special.usps.com /testkits Covid-19 on site testing can no longer be provided Yesterday, the Vermont State School Nurse Association (VSSNA) verified that administering diagnostic tests (including Covid-19) without a medical provider's order is outside the scope of practice of school nurses.

So, I will no longer be able to administer testing at school. Rapid tests will still be available to take home

Since I only have a finite supply, the tests will be limited to those with symptoms.

### **KEEPING CES HEALTHY**

- If your child is sick please keep them home.
- The CES "'sick kids stay home criteria" is:
- fever within the last 24 hours
- significant cold symptoms including a cough and runny nose
- Any kind of rash
- Antibiotics within the last 24 hours

- If your child has a mild residual cough, it is helpful to all if they wear a mask
- Masking is not required but we support anyone that chooses to wear one to protect themselves or others

If your child has Covid like symptoms, testing can prevent transmission to others

If they test positive, isolation for at least 5 days is required.

Notify the school. We are still required to report cases to the Department of Health

Day 0 is the first day of symptoms or positive test, whichever happens first

Isolation can end after day 5 if fever free for 24 hours without fever reducing medication and feeling better.

It is highly recommended to mask through day 10.

Please notify the school if your child has Covid-19.

#### Karate Kids (ages 5-10)

The Karate Kids Program is designed specifically for children ages 5 through 10. The emphasis is on gross motor skills and activities that are developmentally and age appropriate. Students engage in physical activities that work on balance, coordination, fitness, flexibility, speed, timing, and power skills, along with traditional martial arts movements.
