CES "HOUR OF CODE" Week: December 5−9, 2022

What is the Hour of Code?

The Hour of Code started as a one-hour introduction to computer science, designed to demystify "code", to show that anybody can learn the basics, and to broaden participation in the field of computer science. It has since become a worldwide effort to celebrate computer science, starting with 1-hour coding activities but expanding to all sorts of community efforts. Check out the tutorials and activities. This grassroots campaign is supported by over 400 partners and 200,000 educators worldwide.

When is the Hour of Code?

The Hour of Code takes place each year during Computer Science Education Week (December 5-9) but you can host an Hour of Code all year-round. Computer Science Education Week is held annually in recognition of the birthday of computing pioneer Admiral Grace Murray Hopper (December 9, 1906).

Why computer science?

Every student should have the opportunity to learn computer science. It helps nurture problem-solving skills, logic and creativity. By starting early, students will have a foundation for success in any 21st-century career path.

Covid-19 on site testing can no longer be provided Yesterday, the Vermont State School Nurse Association (VSSNA) verified that administering diagnostic tests (including Covid-19) without a medical provider's order is outside the scope of practice of school nurses.

So, I will no longer be able to administer testing at school. Rapid tests will still be available to take home

Since I only have a finite supply, the tests will be limited to those with symptoms.

KEEPING CES HEALTHY

- If your child is sick please keep them home.
- The CES "'sick kids stay home criteria" is:
- fever within the last 24 hours
- significant cold symptoms including a cough and runny nose
- Any kind of rash
- Antibiotics within the last 24 hours

- If your child has a mild residual cough, it is helpful to all if they wear a mask
- Masking is not required but we support anyone that chooses to wear one to protect themselves or others

If your child has Covid like symptoms, testing can prevent transmission to others

If they test positive, isolation for at least 5 days is required.

Notify the school. We are still required to report cases to the Department of Health

Day 0 is the first day of symptoms or positive test, whichever happens first

Isolation can end after day 5 if fever free for 24 hours without fever reducing medication and feeling better.

It is highly recommended to mask through day 10.

Please notify the school if your child has Covid-19.





Karate Kids (ages 5-10)
