

What is JROTC all about?

This course is designed to teach high school students the value of leadership, service to the community, wellness, fitness, health, first aid, thinking and reasoning, life skills, personal responsibility and a sense of accomplishment while instilling in them self-esteem, teamwork, and self discipline. Students also participate in physical exercise, team sports and organizational drill and ceremony. They can earn numerous ribbons, awards, advancement in rank and staff positions. Other activities include voluntary teams which compete at drill meets within the Midwest region. These teams include Regulation Drill, Color Guard, Exhibition Drill, Raiders (adventure training) and Rifle Team. Students also have the opportunity to attend a free JROTC Cadet Leadership Adventure Course/Camp in the Summer. JROTC meets the requirements for Physical Education and health credits if repeated a second year.

JROTC is a safe environment for students to grow while developing discipline and leadership skills. It is also a great place to meet people with similar interests. Enrolling in JROTC does not mean that you have any obligation to the military.

JROTC Facts

Teaches students to improve themselves.

Prepares student to do their best in school and life.

Increases students' interest in their country and community.

Develops students' confidence and self-discipline.

Gives students something important to belong to.

All uniforms and equipment are issued free of charge.

There is NO military obligation for being a part of JROTC.

The JROTC course is an elective with full course credit.

Enrolling in JROTC for two years qualifies as your health and PE credit.

You can be part of the program for one, two, three or four years.

The classes are taught by Army Instructors, assisted by the Senior Cadets.

The JROTC offers both in-school and after-school activities such as color guard, drill team, JROTC Summer Camp, dances and JROTC ball, community service, and parades.

JROTC Teams

The JROTC teams are groups of cadets commanded by upper classmen who compete in area, regional, and national competitions. Teams consist of drill teams, rifle marksmanship teams, academic and leadership teams, and cyber security teams.

Drill Team With Weapons (IDR w/wpns): This team follows a set routine using drill type weapons. The routine is regulation drill with weapons.

Drill Team Without Weapons (IDR w/out)/ First Year Drill Squad: These teams also follow a set routine but does not use weapons.

Color Guard: This team follows a set routine. The team is composed of two colors (flags) and two guards with weapons.

Honor Guard (Exhibition drill with weapons): Honor Guard is a team that puts ingenuity and skill together. They perform tosses and spins with weapons while marching to a routine.

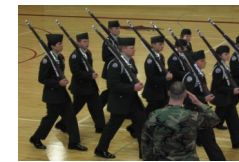
Black Sabers (Exhibition drill without weapons): This is similar to honor guard except without weapons.

Rifle Team: This team fires air rifles in city competitions.

Raider Team: A physically and mentally demanding team that competes in various events such as the one rope bridge, 10k road march, land navigation, and the army physical fitness test consisting of push-ups, sit-ups and the two mile run.

CyberPatriot Team: Discover how to secure computers and networks as a network administrator. Plan network architecture. Compete in national competitions.

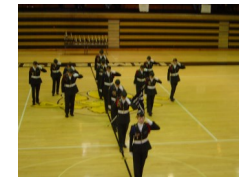
