Talk Sup Week 17 Review and Preview

Good morning Sayreville. I hope you had a relaxing and enjoyable weekend. Welcome to another edition of Talk Sup, my weekly newsletter. Please remember that we will dismiss students early today, Monday, January 9th so that staff can participate in professional development. Likewise, please also remember that schools will be closed on Monday, January 16th in observance of Martin Luther King Day, and that we will dismiss students early every day that week (Tuesday, January 17th through Friday, January 20th) so that our faculty can participate in afternoon and evening Parent/Teacher Conferences.



While we secretly wish that we will not have to exercise any hazardous weather-related school closures or schedule changes (delayed opening or early dismissal) this year, since we are now in the middle of winter, below please find some tips to prepare you for such just in case:

- Have contingency plans in place for child care if schools are closed for the day or on a delayed opening or early dismissal schedule.
- Have a secondary plan in place in case roads between your home and the school or your workplace are closed.
- Ensure that you have emergency contact information for family members, friends, or neighbors who might need to assist you in case of an emergency.



Likewise, below please find some very important winter busing safety tips for our students and their parents.

- Arrive early at the bus stop and dress appropriately for the weather (heavy jackets, hats, mittens, gloves or boots!)
- Students should wait for the bus several feet further back off the road in a safe place, as the roads can be slippery.
- when boarding and exiting the bus to prevent slips and falls on icy steps.
- Before crossing in front of the bus, wait for an "all clear" from the driver. Cross 10 feet in front of the bus so the driver can see you as you cross.

Annual Reorganization Meeting Tuesday, January 2, 2024

After emerging from Executive Session, which was closed to the public, thanked the Board for re-electing them to serve as the BOE officers for 2023. The Board then moved the action items from the Superintendent's Report onto the Board Agenda and approved them all. To see the Business Meeting Agenda, click here. To see all attachments, click here. Among other motions, on the Vision 2030 Finance and Infrastructure portion of the agenda, the BOE awarded a lease purchase contract for technology equipment to Municipal Leasing Consultants to provide lease purchase financing to the Board in a principal amount up to \$382,866.36 and an effective interest rate of 4.470% for the principal amount of \$382,866.36 over a three-year period. In addition, it amended the award for the bid to replace the walk-in refrigerator at Sayreville Middle School (SMS) to George Koustas Ptg & Construction Co. as the lowest responsible bidder in the amount \$249,000 for bids opened on December 22, 2022.

On the Personnel portion of the agenda, as well as other motions, the Board of Education approved the appointment of non-certificated staff for the 2022-23 school year. Likewise, it appointed non-certificated substitutes for the 2022-23 school year.

During the Board Discussion portion of the meeting, Mr. Esposito and Mrs. Bloom thanked the Board for having the confidence in them to elect them as 2023 BOE officers.

During this meeting, the Board will resume publicly reviewing and discussing the 2023-24 School District Budget with the following budget presentations: Individual Schools, Curriculum and Instruction, and Athletics. 
sing Happy Birthday a classmate from the Ukraine.
