### Mental Health and School Breaks (Students)



- 1. **Be aware of your needs**: Be kind to yourself. Recognize what your triggers are to help you prepare for stressful situations.
- 2. Set boundaries: It is okay to say "No".
- 3. **Demonstrate empathy or Be willing to listen to others**: Understanding and recognizing that not everyone thinks as you, and has not been in your shoes.
- 4. Eat well and get enough sleep.
- 5. Tone and Voice: When speaking with one another, treat one another how you want to be.
- 6. **Agree to Disagree**: You will not win every battle, and need to understand no one thinks as you do, and not finding consensus.
- 7. **Self-Care**: Prioritize <u>YOU</u>. You need to give yourself a break, reward yourself, and compliment how AMAZING you are.
- 8. Practice relaxation techniques: Mindful breathing, meditation, and taking a break to refocus.
- Find a trusted support: Talking to a friend, counselor, therapist, parents, or support group can help. If you or someone you love is experiencing a crisis, you can call the National Suicide Prevention Line at 1-800-273-8255; use the Crisis Text Line by texting NAMI to 741-741 to connect with a trained crisis counselor for free, 24/7 crisis support via text message or text 988.

### Mental Health and School Breaks (Parents)

1. Accept your child's needs: Recognize what your child's triggers are to help them prepare for stressful situations.

- 2. Being aware of your needs: Be kind to yourself. Ask for help when needed.

- 4. **Showing and being empathetic**: Understanding and recognizing that not everyone thinks as you, and has not been in your shoes.
- 5. Eat well and get enough sleep.
- 6. Communication: Checking in on how your child is doing.
- 7. **Self-Care**: Prioritize <u>YOU</u>. You need to give yourself a break, reward yourself, and compliment how AMAZING you are.
- 8. Practice relaxation techniques: Mindful breathing, meditation, and taking a break to refocus.
- Find a trusted support: Talking to a friend, counselor, therapist, or support group can help.
