

#### **School News:**

**Safety:** SMFCSD Middle Schools are Cell Phone Free this year so students can focus on learning and positive relationships without the distraction of their cell phones. We have found that Cell phone use on campus has resulted in significant distraction to the academic environment and Online bullying takes place at an accelerated rate due to student cell phone use on campus.

Students are expected to have their Yondr every day even if they don't have a phone on campus. The **Yondr** must be shown at the gates prior to entering campus. All phones must be turned off and inside the Yondr pouch during the school day. More information about Yondr can be found here.

**Wellness** Rainy Day Lunch Procedures: We want our students to stay safe and dry when it rains. We welcome the rain in California. Please review this Rainy Day plan with them.

6th grade students eat in the Barneson Gym. After they eat, students can stay in the gym or go to the library or chill zone with a pass.

All 7th and 8th grade students eat at the tables in the Barneson gym or under the covered hallway near rooms 25-35. 7th and 8th graders can eat together.

Students must throw away their trash after they eat their lunch. After students are finished eating, they can go to the library with a pass, the Chill Zone with a pass or the New Gym with a pass. Ms. Notte or Ms. Brilhart distributes passes.

Students are expected to be responsible, respectful and safe. Students must walk to locations as it can be slippery. Students must stay stationary while eating. When students select a location to go to after eating, they must stay there for the entire time of the lunch.

**Feliz Dia de Los Muertos**: Traditionally celebrated on November 1st and 2nd, though other days, such as October 31 or November 6, may be included depending on the locality. It is widely observed in Mexico, where it largely developed, and is also observed in other places, especially by people of Mexican heritage, and now widely celebrated throughout Latin America.
