SCHOOL NEWS

Safety: Thank you for your attention to and comments regarding the recent communications about safety. It takes a village. We anticipated that as we messaged multiple ways to report



concerning behavior in order to help those in need, that we'd see an uptick in reporting. We are again thankful that students and families feel more comfortable reaching out in person, through email and through the new Anonymous Alerts. As a reminder, the app can be downloaded and accessed on a computer. The password is sanmateofoster. More information can be found on our website.

Though we had this serious communication this week it's important that we look at the big picture. Our data shows that there is a decrease in physicality from last year. What we have put in place is working. Right now our top behavior we want to improve this quarter is students **tardy to school and to their classes**.

The first class starts at 8:20AM. So please plan on making sure your student **arrives by 8:15AM** show they have time to show their Yondr and walk to class. Student have five minutes to walk to each class. There is plenty of time to be on time to class. It is expected that students are seated when the bell rings and take out their materials to learn. Each teacher is expected to have a tardy policy that includes parent communication when they notice multiple tardies in a quarter. The assistant principal hosts a monthly after school detention for chronically tardy students. In




that detention they made a reflective plan to improve. We know that we have to be on time for work. Our students need to learn that habit to be on time for school. If possible, drop your child off at school. I walk up to the park daily and, at 8:12, students know it's time to learn and come into school with their phones all in their Yondr pouches. Student Achievement: The implementations for the new curriculum in science and social studies are going well. The increased math support is showing great gains across the district. We just sent our first communication about a **math boost class**. If you got the invitation, please respond. It will help your child. ELA will be piloting new curriculum in the spring. The district is looking for parents with diverse perspectives to help identify culturally diverse novels as part of the adoption. Let me know if you are interested.

Our new **electives** are going great! **CCE** (**College Career Exploration**) is a semester-long class where students in 7th and 8th grade explore careers in pairs in hands on experiences. Just this week, I saw students build a windmill while studying alternative energy, plate a dish in the culinary unit, and build and shoot off a rocket!

The **Peer Advocates** class at Borel Middle School is an elective health and leadership class that consists of 7/8 graders. The mission of this class is to promote community within Borel, along with advocating in the prevention of vaping nicotine and cannabis, along with promoting other positive health behaviors of students. The Peer Advocates class will take their "first roadshow" and present information on vaping to 5th grade students at Sunnybrae, San Mateo Park, and Laurel Elementary Schools on Thursday, October 27th. The Peer Advocates class are in partnership with the San Mateo County of Education Tobacco Use and Prevention Education grant.

Our **Leadership** class has been planning activities at lunch, organizing a sock drive for Samaritan and an upcoming Spirit Week! Stay tuned!

On Thursday, September 22, the **AVID** classes traveled to Levi's Stadium as the centerpiece of their ongoing participation in 49ers EDU programming. Students explored the connections between art and football, and how STEAM educational concepts are evident in the stadium. Students toured the museum and stadium, and engaged in a classroom activity where they constructed their own football-related art exhibit. The experience was a memorable community building opportunity.

Parents are starting to ask about **high schools**. Now is the right time to plan ahead. The schools are having information nights. In our Coffee Chat survey, A parent asked about how to support their child and get feedback from the teacher. Here's some tips.

- Ask your child how classes are going. Ask them to walk you through an assignment or show you
 graded work. Often teachers use rubrics on bigger point projects and you can look at the rubric with
 your child to understand what they did well and areas of growth.
- Reach out via schoolloop with questions. Some teachers have transitioned over to Parent Square, but not all have been trained yet.
- If your child is struggling academically you will be able to sign up first for Student Parent Teacher Conferences that will be held mid November. More information coming soon.
- This week is the last week of the quarter so please check schoolloop. If you can't get in I can reset it for you after this meeting. If your child is in sixth grade, most likely they will have a new elective next week. Most students rotate between art, spanish, drama and technology. The exceptions are if they have a special class per their IEP or are required to talk an ELD class. Our goal is to exit students as many students as possible out of both classes during their time at Borel so they can take electives of their interest.

Thanks again to our Outdoor Education leaders Kimielou Gilchrist and Paula Spaulding and to the teachers who volunteered to go with the students. They are having fun!

Thanks to PTA for donating Bobcat shirts to each Newcomer student so they too can show Bobcat pride on Fridays. They also have helped recently by funding sports equipment so students can play during lunch and also to help buy snacks for our brunch! Finally thanks for coming to the coffee chat and sharing your ideas! It was great to connect with you!
