INCLUDED IN THE 2023 PLAN:



New Elementary School

Includes all costs for a school similar to the district's newest schools, including a library media center, gym and cafeteria. The location has not yet been determined.



High School Expansion

Includes classroom space, a new practice gym, and a new cafeteria and kitchen. The school could have two lunch periods, instead of four, which would increase instructional time and allow meals to be served at appropriate times. The style will match the existing buildings.

- Safety Corridor at Mustang Elementary, which will connect buildings so students don't have to walk outdoors to the cafeteria.
- ✓ Playground Refreshes, which will update outdoor equipment at elementary and intermediate schools.
- Heating & Air Conditioning in Gyms at Mustang MS & Mustang North MS, which will provide a climate-controlled space for school activities and events.

The 2023 investment plan is expected to cost those who live in a \$100,000 home about \$1.83/month. The investment for the average Mustang household

will be \$4.34/month.

The district has developed a vision to meet the needs of current students and to prepare for the future. By achieving this plan over three phases, the district can continue to address enrollment growth, maintain current school facilities and expand opportunities for students - while minimizing the impact to local residents.

Priorities will be identified and reassessed, with community input, before the 2027 and 2031 phases begin. This approach also allows the community to achieve currently unattainable and not-yet-needed building options in the future.

Best of all, after the 2023 phase, no projected tax increase is expected to complete the remaining phases.

This plan builds on the progress of previous bond programs, thanks to the generosity of the Mustana community.

DID YOU KNOW?

The district is growing!

District enrollment is expected to grow by **6,200** students over the next nine years - **a 46% increase!** We've grown by 561 students just this year!

Classroom space is limited.

Every building is constructed to safely and effectively serve a specific number of students. Currently, every MPS elementary school is using more than 82% of building capacity, and half of the elementary schools are **over** capacity.

These improvements are critical.

This plan addresses urgent needs. Without these improvements, the district could face increased class sizes, deferred building maintenance and budget reductions.

Mustang invests less in facilities than our peers.

Among the 6A districts, Mustang Public Schools ranks **20th out of 24** for the amount invested per student on capital projects. In fact, MPS currently spends \$346 less per student than the 6A average. Based on available data, the proposed investment plan would move Mustang to 15 out of 24.
