Service	Service Description
<b><i>Nursing Services</i></b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Provided by a certified school nurse, a registered nurse or a licensed practical nurse (depending on the service requested) upon referral from the school district’s Director of Special Education.</li> <li>● Services offered by CAIU school nursing staff include:                             <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ Providing consultation on nursing role, duties, and functions as it pertains to the health needs of students enrolled in the district</li> <li>○ Providing assistance in developing and implementing Individual Health Plans (IHPs) for students</li> <li>○ Providing assistance with Student Health Record Maintenance</li> <li>○ Providing assistance with Health Room set-up and maintenance</li> <li>○ Providing community resources for staff training on health and medication related topics (i.e., Asthma, Diabetes, Epilepsy, Diastat Administration, EpiPen, CPR/First Aid, etc.)</li> <li>○ Providing assistance in conducting annual mandated health screenings</li> <li>○ Providing assistance with physician contacts</li> <li>○ Providing direct nursing service to individual students as per the student’s IHP and when contracted by the district</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
<b><i>Spot Vision Screening</i></b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Provided by a CAIU nurse trained by a certified school nurse when the district school nurse is unable to complete vision screening due to students’ disability or inability to respond to standard screening tests</li> <li>● The Spot Vision hand-held autorefractor is used to measure refraction – the ability of the eye’s optics to clearly focus images onto the retina</li> <li>● Results are generated, interpreted, and documented in the student’s health record</li> <li>● If screening results warrant further evaluation, a recommendation is made for parents to have the child seen by a physician</li> </ul>
