Test Optional

The number one question asked by the high school class of 2023 is, "Should I take the SAT/ACT?"

The answer is YES. Test optional admissions may be here to stay. However, some majors will require SATs, some schools will offer merit based on test scores, and some schools will still require standardized tests for admissions.

- Why did you choose this school?
- What do you like most about college classes?
- How do you balance your school work with your job/extracurricular activities/internship?
- Is there help with job placement after graduation?

REQUESTING RECOMMENDATIONS

TEACHER RECOMMENDATIONS

in the spring of junior year to
request a letter of
recommendation. Follow up with
the teacher in the fall to verify the
student's first application
deadline. Teachers cannot upload
recommendations until transcript
release form is turned in.

COUNSELOR RECOMMENDATIONS

Counselors will write on behalf of all of their students. Students must complete student recommendation form in Naviance when (before) they hand in the Transcript Release Form. Parents are encouraged to complete Parent recommendation form on Naviance.

COMPONENTS OF THE FINANCIAL AID PACKAGE

- **Grants** students do not have to repay grants. They are typically given for athletics, academics, special talent, need-based, etc.
- Scholarships Students also do not have to repay scholarships.
 Scholarships can be awarded for athletics, academic excellence or special talent.
- **Loans** These must be repaid. There are two types of loans: federal student loans and private loans.
- College Work Study Work study allows colleges to hire students for employment to pay their own way as they attend college. You do not repay the money earned.

College Scholarship Service (CSS) Profile

- Each school has its own CSS Profile deadline, but many schools request applications by the students earliest deadline.

The major difference between the FAFSA and the CSS Profile is that the FAFSA provides federal grants, loans, and other types of government assistance, and the CSS Profile is an application that universities use to gauge how much non-federal financial aid you need.

ACTION ITEMS

- Search and build list of colleges in Naviance
- Register for standardized test(s) SAT in March @ NAHS
- Keep a file of usernames and passwords of all of your accounts (Naviance, College Board, Common App, FAFSA)
- Visit colleges in person or virtually
- Solidify recommendations (teacher & guidance counselor)
- Fill out Student/Parent Recommendation Form in Naviance
- Start Common Application
- Submit Transcript Release Form 30 days before deadline
- Send official standardized test scores
- Complete FAFSA (CSS Profile)
- Submit application and supporting documents!

COMMON APPLICATION ESSAY PROMPTS

- Some students have a background, identity, interest, or talent that is so
 meaningful they believe their application would be incomplete without it. If this
 sounds like you, then please share your story.
- The lessons we take from obstacles we encounter can be fundamental to later success. Recount a time when you faced a challenge, setback, or failure. How did it affect you, and what did you learn from the experience?
- Reflect on a time when you questioned or challenged a belief or idea. What prompted your thinking? What was the outcome?
- Reflect on something that someone has done for you that has made you happy or thankful in a surprising way. How has this gratitude affected or motivated you?
- Discuss an accomplishment, event, or realization that sparked a period of personal growth and a new understanding of yourself or others.
- Describe a topic, idea, or concept you find so engaging that it makes you lose all track of time. Why does it captivate you? What or who do you turn to when you want to learn more?
- Share an essay on any topic of your choice. It can be one you've already written, one that responds to a different prompt, or one of your own design.
