
Fostering disciples of Christ through faith, service and academics.



An English theologian and scholar, John Henry Newman did not begin his life in the Catholic Church, raised instead in the Church of England. When only fifteen years old, John Henry Newman was said to have had such a strong religious experience, that it would alter the course of his life forever. An experience that he called his first conversion.

Though ordained as an Anglican priest, John Henry Newman was not pleased with the direction the Church of England was taking and worked with several associates to bring about a reformation of the church. Though the written word was used to share their message, Newman used the best method he had to educate the masses... his voice. A strong believer in education, John Henry Newman used sermons and public lectures performed throughout England to stand for change.

As he continued to study and teach Christian history, Newman began yet another conversion, one that led him to reconsider his views on Catholicism. At the time, Catholics continued to be persecuted and reviled, but times were changing, and John Henry Newman's beliefs changed as well. This transformation led Newman to join the Catholic Church; becoming Fr. John Henry Newman in 1845. For the remainder of his life, Fr. Newman led a life devoted to sharing God's word through education, believing that education in faith is education of both heart and the mind.

For over 70 years, Newman Catholic Schools has used the teachings of Saint John Henry Newman as guiding principles to which the schools' mission is based. As the Newman system enters the 2022-2023 school year, it does so with renewed passion of educating the whole child, not just the mind but helping students deepen their relationship with God. Newman Catholic Schools will move forward under the guiding message...

Fostering disciples of Christ through faith, Service and academics.

God has created me to do Him some definite service; He has committed some work to me which He has not committed to another. I have my mission. I may never know it in this life, but I shall be told it in the next. I am a link in a chain, a bond of connection between persons. He has not created me for nothing. I shall do good; I shall do His work.



State of NCS

Though it is often believed that summertime in a school system is a time of relaxation, it is actually a time of preparation. A time for administration and their teams to close out the year and prepare for the coming school year. A time for the system's District Office to close out the financial year and review the State of NCS.

The past two years have been challenging as we have all had to deal with unexpected disruptions and change, but the staff, students and parents of Newman Catholic Schools have dealt with the unknown with grace and continued dedication to the system. As we look towards the 2022-2023 school year, we can do so knowing that the system is poised for success and in a position of financial stability. In the spring of 2021, Newman Catholic Schools announced several difficult decisions that had to be made to help balance the budget. Implementation of necessary change and strengthened management of funds has ensured Newman Catholic Schools has a strong foundation to build upon.

The balanced budget has allowed several projects to commence this summer; including phase one of the installation of a new heating and cooling system at the middle and high school. The original boiler system will be replaced over the next three years; Year 1: HVAC installation on the second floor, Year 2: first floor HVAC installation, and Year 3: installation in the gymnasium and commons/lunchroom. Additional projects include repairs to the middle/high school parking lot, gym floor and stage. These capital projects are made possible through private donations, which have also allowed NCS the ability to improve staff salaries to remain competitive.

Beginning in the 2019-2020 school year, NCS initiated a curriculum review process to assist in improving instructional offerings and implementing outcomes-based instruction. Step one was to tackle Mathematics. Educators worked with Amy Mettlach, Director of Instruction, to evaluate and select a new mathematics curriculum. Once written, the updated curriculum was implemented, first at the elementary level before expanding to the middle school program and high school algebra. Through strengthened assessments and STAR testing, educators have witnessed significant gains in student achievement.

Recently, the English Language Arts curriculum underwent the same process and new textbooks have been purchased. Additional curriculum improvements occurred within the system's religion programs, social studies, and several Advanced Placement courses. Advanced Placement Biology test scores were recently published and showed significant improvement in student achievement over past years. A testament to the dedication of faculty who have embraced outcomes-based instruction.

Newman Catholic Schools just completed the second year of the five-year strategic plan. Each domain area is working hard to move towards completion of goals; sharing updates regularly with the system's guiding body, the NCS Education Commission. Newman Catholic Schools will use the current strategic plan as a guide into the 2024-2025 school year.

Newman Catholic Schools asks all stakeholders to remain engaged and help the system rise up to meet new challenges. Without stakeholders giving of themselves through time, talent and financial support, Newman Catholic Schools would not succeed in bringing excellence in Catholic education to its students. 

History of Newman Catholic Schools



1849 - The first Wausau Catholic Mass took place in the home of Walter McIndoe.

1861 - St. Mary Parish was established as the first Catholic Church in Wausau.

1883 - St. Mary Parish opened a Catholic school at the cost of \$6,000. Five Notre Dame Sisters from Milwaukee came to teach in the new two-story, four classroom structure.

1883-1970



As new parishes started in our community, Catholic schools continued to grow. Schools were managed and funded by the parishes they were affiliated.

1951 - Bishop John P. Treacy established Newman High School on February 6, 1951. A decision made in response to the need for a Catholic secondary school.

September 1951, the first freshman class was held at St. Mary School. 78 "Pioneers" attended classes within two rooms of the building. As the population grew with each new class, the school expanded into two rooms at St. James School.



1954 - September - October: Local parishes held a fund drive, lead by Fr. Lloyd Geissler, aimed at raising the necessary capital to build a standalone high school.

December: Groundbreaking ceremony at 1130 W. Bridge Street in Wausau.

1955 - May: The first graduating class walked the stage.

Commencement was held at St. Therese School Auditorium since the high school was not complete.

October: Cornerstone on the new building was laid by Bishop Treacy.




1956 - May: Though they never attended class in the building, commencement for the Class of 1956 was held in the Newman High School gymnasium (the roof was not yet complete on the gym). September: First 400 students walked through the doors of the newly finished building.

1958 - Originally known as the Pioneers, the mascot name was changed to the Cardinals in honor of the school's namesake, Cardinal John Henry Newman.

1975 - First Unification Occurs: St. Mary and St. James unified to share their resources and offer a high quality Catholic education. St. James School became St. Francis Cabrini Elementary (Kindergarten-Grade 4)

Mid-1980's - Catholic Parishes, under the leadership of their pastors, began community discussions about expanding the unified system approach initially started between St. James & St. Mary Parishes. 1987: Wausau Area Catholic Schools (WACS) unified system was established and supported by eight parishes; St. James, St. Mary, St. Michael, St. Anne, St. Matthew, Holy Name of Jesus, St. Therese, and St. Mark. Fall 1987: Unified WACS Pre-Kindergarten-Grade 12 Catholic school system classes began with an enrollment of 1,359. All parishes shared their resources to continue the important parish ministry of Catholic school education.





2004 - July: Wausau Area Catholic Schools was renamed Newman Catholic Schools (NCS), connecting the schools more closely by sharing the name of Newman throughout the system. The shift in thinking of WACS as a consolidated school system to Newman as a unified school system was realized. Elementary School at Holy Name was closed.

2006 - A second Child Development Center was established at Holy Name of Jesus Parish.

2010 -Multiple closures/moves occurred: St. Michael Elementary School closed. Holy Name Child Development Center moved to St. Michael Parish, and became known as an Early Childhood Center. St. Matthew Middle School closes with the middle school moved to share the high school building on Bridge Street.

On Saturday, November 6, 2021, the Newman community came together again to show just how much they believe in the students and staff of Newman Catholic Schools. Of the \$230,000 raised, just over \$50,000 will be used to purchase instructional materials as part of the ongoing initiative to strengthening curriculum offerings throughout NCS; including Elementary English Language Arts and Social Studies, Religion, Algebra and Advanced Placement: US History and English.
