If you're awake at 5 a.m., chances are you've watched Jonathan R. Lemire '97 deliver the morning news as host of "Way Too Early with Jonathan Lemire" on national news network MSNBC.

From covering the corridors of power in Washington and New York, to serving as a key political resource on a variety of national news programs, Jonathan earned his awe-inspiring place in the ultra-competitive field of journalism and broadcasting.

But before he dominated the national news scene, he started as a Raider!

Jonathan grew up in Lowell, MA, with his father who was a history teacher at Chelmsford High School, and his mother who taught English at the University of Massachusetts, Lowell. He was raised immersed in history, current events, and recalls his first experience with journalism was regularly reading the Boston Globe sports pages.

Having attended Catholic school from kindergarten, he took his love of English and history to Central Catholic "...because Central was the best option for academics, lifestyle, athletics and a few of my other friends were attending CCHS as well."

While attending CCHS, Jonathan was a tremendous student-athlete participating in indoor and outdoor track and field, and cross country, setting several Merrimack Valley Conference and school records, some of which still stand today. He also found time to stay involved with Amnesty International and the Knowledge Bowl.

He credits his experience at CCHS with several role models including the late teacher and cross country coach Mr. Peter O'Sullivan '67, Mr. Leo F. McCue, former CCHS History teacher, Mr. Chuck "Coach A" Adamopoulos, teacher and long-time football coach, and CCHS President Mr. Christopher Sullivan '81, who served as Director of Admissions while Jonathan attended Central.

"Central Catholic helped shape me and offered a strong sense of community, with a top down approach from both teachers and older students," said Jonathan. "Track also provided me with a really tight group of friends, and we always cheered each other on with a 'we've got each other's backs' environment. I have nothing but fond memories of my time at Central Catholic." Jonathan remains in contact with friends and classmates from CCHS.

After graduating from CCHS in 1997, Jonathan headed to the prestigious Columbia University in New York and earned a bachelor's degree in History. He interned at New York Daily News and after graduation, was asked to stay on as a staffer. Shortly after starting at the newspaper,

Jonathan found himself in NYC during the September II, 2001 terrorist attacks and he worked around the clock bringing the latest news to the world during this unprecedented time.

He continued to spend more than a decade at the New York Daily News, City Hall, and New York's Police and Fire Departments.

In 2013, he joined The Associated Press, the world's largest news gathering organization, as a White House reporter covering the President Trump campaign and administration, national politics, and the federal government, all while splitting his time between New York City and Washington, D.C.

As cable television began wanting print journalists to provide commentary on air, Jonathan became a regular contributor for MSNBC as a political analyst and NBC News, which led to a regular role on the popular morning news program "Morning Joe" (MSNBC).

Ultimately, after serving as a guest host for the 5 a.m. show "Way Too Early" on MSNBC, he was soon named the main host.

He now sits at the helm of "Way Too Early with Jonathan Lemire" and serves as a political analyst for both the MSNBC and NBC News.

Also, after years of working at The Associated Press, he was named White House Bureau Chief for Politico.

Between The Associated Press and Politico, Jonathan has covered two presidential administrations, first President

Donald Trump, whom he interviewed in the Oval Office, and now President Joseph Biden.

In these prestigious positions, he has traveled to the Middle East, Asia and Europe, and has broken scores of news stories and wrote authoritative analysis pieces while covering the day-to-day workings of both presidencies, as well as the 2016 and 2020 campaigns.

He also covered the nation's response to the COVID-19 pandemic, received attention for his news conference questions to President Trump and Russia's Vladimir Putin at their 2018 Helsinki Summit, and reported on the Capitol Hill insurrection (January 6, 2021).

In addition to his "Way Too Early" hosting duties, Jonathan is a frequent guest on MSNBC programs like "Deadline White House with Nicolle Wallace" and "The IIth Hour" and he contributed to the network's coverage of the 2020 election and Biden's inauguration. He also recently authored a book, "THE BIG LIE: Election Chaos, Political Opportunism, and the State of American Politics after 2020," which was released in July 2022.

Jonathan is the only Raider in school history to have received a Champagnat Award (The St. Marcellin Champagnat Award for Outstanding Professional Achievement, 2022), and was also inducted into the CCHS Athletic Hall of Fame for track (2012).

He currently lives in New York with his wife, journalist Mrs. Carrie Melago, and their two sons, and spends an extraordinary amount of time thinking about the Boston Red Sox.



From Local News to Dominating D.C.

LOUISE L. SCHIAVONE '68SM

Louise Schiavone '68SM has spent her life successfully climbing the competitive ladder of local, regional and national journalism and broadcasting during a time when female journalists were few and far between.

Today, a career journalist and senior lecturer at the Johns Hopkins University Carey Business School in Baltimore, MD and Washington, D.C., Louise is still going strong in fulfilling her childhood dream of telling life's stories.

She is heard as a contributing anchor on National Public Radio (NPR), writes about sustainability and the marine environment in a regular column for Forbes.com, with by-lines also appearing in the Los Angeles Review of Books and National Geographic. Her award-winning 2020 short documentary, "Crisis on The Half Shell: The Chesapeake Bay" has been shown at film festivals and marine conservation conferences.

Louise has covered Congress, the White House, the Pentagon, Treasury, State, Transportation, Energy, and Housing Departments, as well as national presidential campaigns, the mortgage meltdown and financial crisis, food safety challenges, and natural disasters as an on-air veteran of CNN, ABC News, and the Associated Press.

"My story has involved swimming upstream in a time when women were fighting for their fair place and compensation at all kinds of work - and on-air women were not a big part of the news business," said Louise.

Born in New York City, Louise's family moved to North Andover, MA, to be near the then-booming textile factories of Lawrence where her father, Rocco Schiavone was an internationally known shoe designer.

She grew up as a second-generation Italian-American to parents who did not use English as a first language. None of her grandparents were born American citizens, but immigrated to the United States in search of opportunity.

Attending Catholic schools and participating in Scouts, summer camps and music lessons gave Louise and her three brothers a foundation her parents never had.

While a student at St. Mary High School in Lawrence, MA, Louise got her start in news writing for the St. Mary's "Marian Monitor," where, not surprisingly, she was Co-Editor-in-Chief – along with classmate Lynne Murphy '68SM.

Louise and the rest of the staff sold advertising space to local businesses, took photographs, cranked out papers at least once a month - more than that, in the case of a blockbuster front-pager which, without question, included the sub-freezing blaze that damaged St. Mary High School.

Graduating from Emmanuel College in Boston, MA in the middle of a recession, Louise wrote commercials for WCCM-AM and FM in Lawrence for \$75 a week. After working a full-day writing advertisements there, the News Director let her pitch in at night, covering local news stories.

Ultimately moving up to the newsroom, she continued to work two jobs: one, full-time, reporting and anchoring at WCCM, while at the same time, working an additional 20 hours a week writing for then all-news WEEI Radio in Boston.

Moving to Washington D.C., Louise wrote speeches, press releases, and constituent correspondence for the late Paul Tsongas, during his first term in Congress, before moving to New York City to pursue a graduate degree in journalism from Columbia University.

It was 1978, and with job offers in Boston and Washington D.C., Schiavone rolled the dice on a city she'd never seen and where, at first, knew exactly one person: Atlanta, Georgia. Jimmy Carter was President, the Atlanta crowd was in national power, and the city was led by the civil rights leaders whose names fill history textbooks.

A year later, flying into Savannah while everyone was evacuating the city, she covered her first hurricane, David. It was a huge national story that ultimately led to a job offer in Washington D.C. with the Associated Press.

From covering the 1981 shooting of then President Reagan, to an appointment as Senate correspondent, to more hurricanes, political chaos and campaigns and beyond, Louise has had a multitude of opportunities that have shaped her career and life.


Today, she shares her extensive professional experience teaching business communication, crisis strategies and business ethics at Johns Hopkins.

"Above and beyond everything else, success involves a lot of work," said Louise. "Hours and hours and hours. That's what it takes to be a creative, successful person."

Creatively, her current focus and passion is the environment and marine biodiversity, which she has had the opportunity to develop with the support of her university.

Louise's older brother **Nicholas P. Schiavone** is a 1967 CCHS graduate. She is married to CCHS alum and fellow journalist **Richard Uliano '69**, a correspondent and anchor on WTOP Newsradio in Washington, D.C. They have a daughter, Christina, a federal attorney in Baltimore, MD.

TV, Meteorologist, FOX61 News (WTIC-TV) (Hartford, CT)

Ryan Breton '12 is a seasoned, on-air Meteorologist for FOX61 News in Hartford, CT. He can be seen forecasting weekends at 10 and 11 p.m. and he reports on topics related to weather, science and the environment on weekday evening newscasts, and serves as the primary fill-in for the station's Chief Meteorologist. Ryan also launched "Climate Matters" - an important and timely initiative, covering climate change's impact on New England. He also designs augmented reality graphics to explain the ins-and-outs of weather. His work has been certified by the AMS and nominated for a Boston-New England regional EMMY award. He is a graduate of Pennsylvania State University (PA) with a degree in Meteorology.

Sports Director at WMUR-TV, ABC 9

Mike Cronin, Jr. '07 is a Regional Edward R. Prior to joining WMUR, Mike was a freelance reporter for NECN and he also worked for Spectrum News 1 in Worcester and started his career working for KFBB in Helena, Montana. Since 2005, Matt has been a News Photographer for FOX 25 Boston covering everything from politics to serious tragedies like the Marathon bombing, and several MLB World Series and past NFL Superbowls.

Matt gained experience in the field as an intern in the WBZ-TV Sports Department, where he worked with legendary Sports Anchor Bob Lobel and the news team of Jack Williams and Liz Walker.

His first TV job was with WNDS-TV 50 recording the famous bowling show and working with Al Kaprlien, the legendary weatherman!

He also worked for Fox Sports and traveled to many sporting events including Tom Brady's first Super Bowl in 2001 in New Orleans and the Subway Series for MLB Yankees vs Mets amongst many other events like the NBA finals. Matt's career highlights include covering four out of the seven Tom Brady Super Bowls that he won, and doing a sit down interview with legends Gene Lavanchy and Jay Leno.

"None of this would have been possible without the education and confidence I had after graduating from Central Catholic," said Matt. "And of course nothing would really be possible without my father **David DeFillippo '66**, fellow Raider!!"

Soon It's Curtain Up— THE REBIRTH OF THE ALLAN B. ROGERS THEATER



Central Catholic's enrollment was growing rapidly in the late 1960s. Central's reputation as a superior college preparatory school for students in the Merrimack Valley had become well-established. The Marist Brothers, alumni, educators and community leaders saw the clear need for the school's expansion to respond to the demand for admission and to provide modern academic facilities for students.

Embedded in school's 1968-1970 expansion plans were "big dreams" for the development of programs and activities in the visual arts, music and performing arts. The designs included art galleries and a 400-seat theater, which would be named in honor of the late Allan B. Rogers. A benefactor of CCHS himself, Allan, along with his father, Irving E. Rogers, publisher of the Eagle Tribune, were among influential community leaders who vigorously supported Central Catholic through its early years.

In 1972 the grand opening of the Allan B. Rogers Theater inspired the founding of the Central Catholic Theatre Guild. Fast forward five decades, in this same theater where Central Catholic students first "trod the boards" to put on those first 1972-1973 performances of "See How They Run," and "Guys and Dolls," Central now prepares to celebrate the 50th Golden Anniversary of the Allan B. Rogers Theater. In tribute to its rich history at CCHS, the Rogers Theater is undergoing a complete renovation and will be reborn with a fresh face and the most advanced theatrical technologies.

Over the 50 years, the Allan B. Rogers Theater has been home to the CCHS Theatre Guild and its 96 shows and over 300 performances by countless talented students who graced its stage. The original wooden stage, which still exists, was donated by Broadway legend and Tony Award winner, Lawrence native, the late Robert Goulet. The Theatre Guild has been blessed with many faculty leaders over the years, most notably, its founder, Thomas Kirkman '60, and talented directors, Karen E. Moynihan '69SM, Sharman A. (Walsh '87) Merrill, and presently, co-directors, Matthew J. Joyal '08 and Christine M. (Leonard '06) Thompson.





The renovations and enhancements to the Allan B. Rogers Theater began in the summer of 2022 and continue throughout the fall. Central's students are wildly excited at the prospect of a cutting edge, new home for theater arts, so excited that they raised tens of thousands of dollars through their most recent annual Walk-a-thon to kick-off the dream of the Rogers Theater rebirth. We are grateful to the spirit, devotion, and leadership of the student body!

The renovations to the Allan B. Rogers Theater, with a price tag of nearly \$250,000, include many of the bells, whistles, and comfortability features of a modern theater:

- Fresh, clean theater seating
- Brightly coated walls
- · New LED house lighting & wiring
- High-tech, digitally controlled theatrical lighting and sound packages
- · Completely refinished front and rear stage
- · Installation of aisle lighting and new carpeting
- Renovated control booth and new control board for sound & lighting systems

For decades to come, the renovations and enhancements to the Allan B. Rogers Theater assure a highly functional and enjoyable venue for theater arts, school assemblies, prayer services, guest speakers and academic enrichment activities.

A 50th Golden Anniversary celebration and re-dedication of the Allan B. Rogers Theater is being planned for the Spring of 2023. Don't miss the details to be announced in the months ahead. It is certain to be a sell-out event!

"At WHDH/CW56, I interned in the Creative Services Department under the supervision of Tiffany Middleton, who saw my drive and desire to work in the industry and let me be her assistant on the promo shoots with the talent, where I got to talk to them and ask all about the industry," said Emily. "Approximately six months after completing my internship, a job opened up in Tiffany's department and she reached out to me to interview, which I ended up landing in February 2019."

Emily found that this internship truly prepped her for the next big step. "I learned how to think on the fly, stick up for my ideas and to not be afraid to make mistakes. This turned out to be the best preparation for an award-winning show like The Tonight Show.

"I have always been a fan of The Tonight Show and Jimmy Fallon himself, so when I saw an open internship available, I figured applying was worth a shot!" said Emily.

She was right... Emily was selected for the internship and within two weeks, she moved to New York City to start her next chapter at Studio 6B at 30 Rockefeller Center.

Celebrating the Catholic Schools Foundation

Central Catholic and the **Catholic Schools Foundation** (CSF) have enjoyed a long, successful relationship resulting in much needed educational support for hundreds of CCHS students.

Over \$3.3 million has been provided by CSF in support of over 250 Central Catholic students through the Montagne Scholars and the CSF Scholars program, providing scholarships for





CSF's generous commitment includes funds for a new \$100K CSF-CCHS-Lawrence Catholic Academy scholarship pilot for students entering in the Class of 2026 from Lawrence Catholic Academy. CSF has also approved a CSF Scholars grant of \$195,000 to support CCHS students for the upcoming year, and supported the CCHS Innovative Learning Summer Academy with grants totaling \$20,000. CSF support for students in the 2022-23 academic year will total over \$290,000.

They also support enrichment opportunities such as scholarships to attend college readiness summer programs at local universities for CCHS students, complimentary admission to Boston-area cultural events, and sporting events.

Established in 1983, CSF changes lives by providing families with demonstrated financial need an opportunity to give their children a quality education, focused on Christian values and character formation at Catholic schools located throughout the Archdiocese of Boston regardless of race, religion, ethnicity, or gender. They have distributed more than \$100 million in scholarship aid to over 50,000 students in the Greater Boston community.


