***Southern Utah University Diversity Promise Scholarship:** Southern Utah University prioritizes the success of students in all aspects of their education. For the upcoming 2023-2024 academic year, we invite you to apply for our Diversity Promise Scholarship. The aim of this scholarship is to eliminate financial barriers for our underserved student populations to promote access to an equitable education. This need-based scholarship can award up to the full tuition for the academic year. Students who are not Pell grant eligible can still be considered for the scholarship. This scholarship is renewable for 8 academic semesters as long as you maintain a 2.0 GPA, complete 70% of your courses, and are a full-time student.

***Utah Valley University Green Light Scholarship:** The GREENLIGHT Scholarship is offered to UVU students who need financial support to pursue their educational goals. This scholarship fills the gap to cover tuition for students who receive the Pell Grant but may still owe additional tuition. For students who qualify, the cost of a two-year degree will be covered by federal aid and UVU. Your first two years are covered!

***BYU Cougar Pell Grant:** Beginning in the 2021-22 academic year, the university will offer eligible new freshman students a last-dollar commitment for eight semesters. Cougar Pell Promise is not a loan, grant, or scholarship. It is a university guarantee to cover any remaining gaps in undergraduate Latter-day Saint tuition charges after grants, scholarships, and benefits are received for eight semesters.

Initial Qualifications

- Apply for and be admitted to BYU during the senior year of high school.
- Complete the online scholarship application by the published [scholarship deadline](#).
- Complete the [Free Application for Federal Student Aid](#) (FAFSA) by January 20 and be certified as Pell-eligible.
- Students who defer their first year for missions or military service MUST complete verification that first year if required, even though they are not attending, to establish initial eligibility.
- Students entering BYU during winter semester must be mid-year high school graduates. Also, they must complete the scholarship application by August 1, and the FAFSA by July 20.

***For Utah Scholarship through the University of Utah:** The For Utah Scholarship is a merit-based and need-based scholarship program awarded to first-time, first-year students who have at least a 3.20 cumulative high school grade point average at the time of admission to the university, are residents of Utah, and are Federal Pell Grant recipients for the Fall 2022 semester. The For Utah Scholarship program provides a commitment that tuition and mandatory fees will be covered by grant and scholarship funds from all sources, up to a maximum of 18 credit hours per semester for which the scholarship is provided. The For Utah Scholarship is a “last dollar” program, which means funds from this program will cover any remaining amount of tuition and mandatory fees not already covered by other grants (such as the Federal Pell Grant) and scholarships (such as the Utah Regents Scholarship, a departmental scholarship, or an outside scholarship).

***Salt Lake Community College SLCC Promise Scholarship:** SLCC Promise helps eligible students pay for their education by covering the cost of tuition and fees when federal grants fall short. The Promise is intended to remove economic barriers and to provide a pathway for SLCC students to complete their degrees.

WHO'S ELIGIBLE

To be eligible for Promise funds, students must:

- Be a Utah resident.
- Receive a Federal Pell Grant.
- Take 9 or more credits in Fall and Spring semester or take 6 or more credits during Summer semester.
- All SLCC students are encouraged to make an appointment with an [academic advisor](#) to create a degree plan and file the plan in SLCC's online [DegreeWorks](#).
- Maintain a 2.0 cumulative GPA and complete 70 percent of attempted course

***Seniors: The Westminster Commitment for Utah Students your tuition fully paid: The Westminster** Commitment is our promise to Utah students. The tuition-free program is for academically driven students from Utah who have financial need. The college is dedicated to providing equitable opportunities, eliminating financial barriers, and opening the door to what a Westminster education offers. The scholarship covers tuition costs for eligible students for 4 years. To qualify for this scholarship, students must:

- Submit an admissions application by the college's Feb. 1 Regular Decision deadline
- Be admitted to Westminster College
- Submit FAFSA
- Have a total family income below \$60,000 and limited assets
- Have a cumulative high school GPA of 3.3 (at the time of admissions)
- Graduate from a Utah high school
- Enroll as a first-time, full-time undergraduate student in the Fall 2023

***Seniors: T. H. Bell Education Scholarship (for future educators)**

The T.H. Bell Scholarship is for those intent on entering the teaching profession in Utah. It can be used at all public or private institutions in Utah that offer an approved program including Brigham Young University, Dixie State University, Salt Lake Community College, Snow College, Southern Utah University, University of Utah, Utah State University, Utah Valley University, Weber State University, Western Governors University, and Westminster College. Changes include:

- This program was previously the T. H. Bell Teaching Incentive Loan Program, but in accordance with [HB 188, T.H. Bell Program Amendments](#) passed in the 2019 legislative session, the program is now a scholarship.
- Awards distributed prior to July 1, 2019, are forgivable loans and after July 1, 2019, are scholarships.

Award:

The Terrel H. Bell Teaching Incentive Loan Program transitioned to the Terrel H. Education Scholarship Program on July 1, 2019. Awards distributed prior to July 1, 2019, are forgivable loans and after July 1, 2019, are scholarships.

The Terrel H. Bell Education Scholarship Program aims to recruit first-generation students into teaching, encourage outstanding students to work in high-need fields, and recognize teaching as a critically important career in Utah. The scholarship can be used at public or private higher education institutions in Utah that offer approved programs: Brigham Young University, Dixie State University, Salt Lake Community College, Snow College, Southern Utah University, University of Utah, Utah State University, Utah Valley University, Weber State University, Western Governors University, and Westminster College.

T.H. Bell Scholarships may be for up to the cost of resident tuition, fees, and books, and may be received for up to four consecutive years. Recipients must study in an approved teacher preparation program or in an approved program that prepares an individual to become a speech-language pathologist or another licensed professional providing services in a public school to students with disabilities.

Eligibility: Undergraduate and graduate students who meet required academic standards, are enrolled in at least six credits, intend to apply to and complete an approved program, and intend to work in a Utah public school are eligible to apply. Scholarship priority: (1) first-generation students who intend to work in any teaching field or licensure area; (2) students who are not first-generation but intend to work in a teaching field or licensure area where there is high need; (3) other students who meet the requirements of the scholarship.

Deadlines: Contact an eligible Utah higher education institution (see above) for more information on the application process and deadlines.

***Seniors: Weber State University “The Edge Scholarship”:** A student receiving a Concurrent Enrollment Edge scholarship will receive a \$2,000 tuition waiver per year for four years (up to \$1,000 per semester for eight semesters) representing a total value of \$8,000. Concurrent Enrollment students will be considered as regular full-time degree-seeking students when they update their *Academic Record* in *eWeber* during their senior year of high school ([see PDF instructions](#)). Students do not need to apply for admission to the university again.

Students are encouraged to submit ACT/SAT scores for other academic scholarship consideration and math and English course placement.

Academic tuition waivers may be deferred for military or religious service.

***ALL: ZIONS BANK® PAYS FOR A'S.**

Hardworking middle school, junior high, and high school students (ages 12 to 18) in Utah and Idaho are paid up to \$1 per "A" on their 2021-2022 report cards. (Sorry, "A-" grades aren't eligible.) They're also entered for a chance to win scholarship savings accounts. They give away 36 awards of \$500 each and two \$1,000 accounts each school year.

How to Get Started

1. Students should bring their most recent report card for the 2021-2022 school year and a parent or guardian to any [branch](#).

The date for this opportunity is June 11- 16, 2023 on the Weber State University campus.

***Seniors:** The PathMaker Scholars Summer Research Program at Huntsman Cancer Institute seeks to increase the participation of underrepresented students in biomedical cancer research and to encourage students to prepare for careers in research, medicine, and education. The program sponsors students for a ten-week residential summer research experience, where they will live on campus, learn laboratory training techniques, and work on a project as indicated by a principal investigator in a university laboratory setting. Accepted students who successfully complete the program will automatically be accepted into the following year's summer program without reapplying.

About the Program

- Accepted students will receive financial compensation of up to \$4,000 for their participation in the 10-week summer program (amount depends on education level).
- Housing expenses and meal plan will be paid for by the program.
- Travel support is available to students who live outside Salt Lake City.
- Accepted students will have the opportunity to apply and attend a national conference to present their summer research. All conference expenses will be paid for by the program.

Eligibility Criteria

- Member of an underrepresented minority group as outlined by the National Institutes of Health
- Citizen or non-citizen national of the United States, or must have current valid Alien Registration Card I-551 or other legal verification of such status
- Current undergraduate students or high school students who have completed their junior year of high school prior to the program start
- Strong interest in pursuing a career in the health sciences and biomedical research

Expectations

Students must commit 40 hours per work week to the program activities, which include their individual research placement and attendance at weekly meetings, program events, and activities. All students are required to present their work at the Summer Research Symposium organized by the Office of Undergraduate Research. During and upon completion of the program, students will be asked to complete surveys to evaluate the program.

- Finally, and importantly, HSF awards more than \$30 million in Scholarships annually and, depending upon available funds, HSF Scholars may also be eligible to receive a scholarship, which range from \$500-\$5,000 and awarded directly to students
