Highland High School is a unique urban high school that blends the feeling of a strong community base with a diverse student body. Highland High is located in the Sugarhouse Area, a suburb of Salt Lake City, which lies along the Wasatch Mountains in Northern Utah. It is one of the four high schools in the Salt Lake City School District. Salt Lake City is Utah's state capitol city with a population of approximately 200,000 residents. Highland High School partners with several local businesses in the Sugarhouse

area and is very close to Westminster College and The University of Utah. Highland High includes many of their faculty and staff among its supportive patrons.

DEMOGRAPHICS: In the last year, our enrollment has increased by 9%. Our demographics remain stable, as has our socio-economic profile. Highland High's community extends from the East bench of the Salt Lake Valley to 7500 West in the Glendale area. This boundary provides Highland with very wide diversity.

Highland values a comprehensive education; offering a wide range of academic, vocational, technical, family science, and fine arts courses. Students may participate in Concurrent Enrollment courses offered through the Salt Lake Community College for college course credits with access to many other courses offered through the district's Career and Technical Center.
