## **Win Boosts Marian Hopes**

### **Tilt Luther South; Rally Beats Latin**

Fresh from a victory in its initial varsity athletic contest, Marian high footballers are ready for their second encounter.

Coach Lee Albrecht's gridders face Luther South Saturday afternoon at Bloom High field. A frosh-soph tilt is set for noon.

Marian came from behind in the second half to spill Chicago Latin 20-6 last Saturday.

A second half backfield switch, which saw Don Curran move from halfback to fullback, Jack Schreiber take over at halfback and Eugene Mulderink come in as quarterback had a beneficial effect on Marian.

Curran counted two touchdowns, on runs of 20 and 7 yards, and also ran for two extra points.

Schreiber set up Marian's third period tally with a 37 yard sprint to the Latin 2. Tom Novelli plunged across the goal line and Curran added the point.

Latin scored in the second quarter after numerous Marian fumbles.

"We started to jell in the second half," Albrecht said, "but we were miserable that first half. We fumbled seven times, three times on punt receptions."

Curran's two fourth period tallies iced the decision for Marian. He led the ground gainers with 68 yards in eight attempts. Novelli picked up 57 yards in the same number of carries.

Captain Jim Osika did some fine blocking at offensive guard and sparkled as a defensive linebacker. He picked off two Latin aerals. Jim Addyman starred both ways at tackle.

Albrecht credited the punting of Dave Gyger with "keeping us in the game the first half."

Marian starters for the Luther South tilt will be Mike Mancini and Dennis Carr, ends; Mike Sauve and Jim Addyman, tackles; Osika and Bill Ricchiuto, guards; and Jim Christ, center.

Joe Bijak will start at quarterback, while Novelli and Schreiber are the halfbacks and Curran the fullback.

Season tickets for Marian's home football and basketball games are on sale. The prices are \$10 for adults and \$5 for students. Single admissions for Saturday's contest are \$1 and 50 cents.
